Prime Minister Narendra Modi has spoken to Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma and Sikkim Chief Minister Prem Singh Tamang on the situation arising due to heavy rainfall and floods in the Northeast. Mr Modi has assured all help and support to the affected states. Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma said in a social media post that the Prime Minister called him to enquire about the current flood situation in Assam. Mr Sarma briefed him about the relief operation undertaken by the state government. Meanwhile, Sikkim Chief Minister Prem Singh Tamang extended his gratitude for the Prime Minister's concern and support regarding the landslide and flood situation in Sikkim. He noted that the state administration remains fully committed to managing the situation and providing all necessary assistance to those affected.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has invited the world's leading aviation companies to invest in India, saying India has emerged as the world's third-largest domestic aviation market. Addressing the International Air Transport Association's Annual General Meeting in New Delhi, Mr. Modi said, India presents an excellent opportunity for investment for the world's leading aviation companies. He underscored India's investment in world-class airport infrastructure, noting that in 2014, the country had 74 operational airports, which have now expanded to 162. Emphasising the success of the UDAN scheme and calling it a golden chapter in Indian civil aviation history, Mr Modi stated that under this initiative, over 15 million passengers have benefited from affordable air travel.

Incessant Rain continues in Arunachal Pradesh. Meteorological Centre Itanagar has predicted heavy rain accompanied by thunderstorms with lightning and gusty wind at isolated places across the state over the next 24 hours. The centre has issued an orange alert for Lower Subansiri, Dibang Valley and East Siang districts and a yellow alert for 17 other districts in the state. As weather department has predicted heavy rainfall in the three districts, administration has issued orders prohibiting fishing, collection of woods and other materials from river bed and low lying areas East Siang, Lower Subansiri and Dibang Valley Districts.

According to the State Department of Disaster Management, 12 people have lost their lives in rain related incidents till Monday evening. Two persons are reportedly missing during the heavy rain

period. The Meteorological Centre Itanagar has issued a yellow alert warning for almost all the districts in the state. The weather predicted heavy rainfall department has accompanied by thunderstorms and lightning at isolated places over the next 24 hours. The State Department of Disaster Management has informed that as of now 3 relief camps are set up and there are 239 inmates in these camps. 168 villages have been affected due to flood and landslides and 2249 persons including women and children have been evacuated to safer places. So far 92 roads have been damaged in the last four days. In Upper Subansiri District, the PMGSY road from Sippi to Nilling has been blocked at multiple locations due to flash flood and landslides triggered by heavy rain. According to reports, 17 to 18 villages are cut off due to this blockade.

Europe's most active volcano Mount Etna in Italy erupted yesterday, spewing ash and smoke into the Sicilian sky and triggering panic among tourists. Sicily president, Renato Schifani said, lava flows emitted in the eruption had not passed the natural containment area, and posed no danger to the population. Authorities continue to monitor the situation closely and have advised the public to stay cautious as volcanic activity persists.

The Indian Army's Spear Corps carried out a major civic outreach initiative under Operation Sadbhavna in Ziro, Arunachal Pradesh, reaffirming its commitment to holistic development, community welfare, and nation-building. The event was attended by Former Minister Tage Taki, DC Lower Subansiri and District Chairperson of Apatani Tribe Dola Pura.
