The Union Cabinet chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi held a meeting in New Delhi today. The cabinet approved to establish International Potato Centre (CIP)'s South Asia Regional Centre (CSARC) at Agra in Uttar Pradesh to increase food and nutrition security, farmers' income and job creation. The cabinet also approved Revised Jharia Master Plan (JMP) in Jharkhand to address issues related to fire, land subsidence, and the rehabilitation of affected families in Jharia Coalfield. The Cabinet approved setting up of ₹ 417 crore Electronics Manufacturing Cluster (EMC 2.0) at Gautam Buddha Nagar in Uttar Pradesh. It aims to boost local manufacturing and innovation. Furthermore, the Cabinet decided to extend Pune Metro Rail Project Phase-II in Maharashtra with the cost of three thousand 626 crore rupees. Briefing the media, Information and Broadcasting Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said, additional length of 12.75 kilometers will be added as the new metro line with 13 stations.

Union Cabinet chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi resolved to commemorate and honor the sacrifices of countless individuals who resisted Emergency and its attempt at subversion of the spirit of Indian Constitution, subversion which began in 1974 with attempt at crushing Navnirman Andolan and Sampoorna Kranti Abhiyaan. To mark the occasion, a two minute silence was observed in today's meeting of Union cabinet, where they paid tributes to all people who suffered due to excesses of Emergency and for their exemplary courage and valiant resistance. The year 2025 marks 50 years of Samvidhan Hatya Diwas, an unforgettable chapter in the history of India. Union Home Minister Amit Shah released a book 'The Emergency Diaries-Years that forged a leader' in New Delhi this evening.

Arunachal Pradesh today joined rest of the nation in observing Samvidhan Hatya Divas. Speaking at a function held at DK Convention Centre in Itanagar, Governor Lt. Gen. K.T. Parnaik (Retd.) said the day serves as a reminder of the Emergency period and importance of preventing any misuse of power in a democratic setup. The Governor emphasized that Samvidhan Hatya Divas is an opportunity for citizens to reflect on role of the Constitution in

upholding democratic values and protecting fundamental rights. Speaking on the occasion, Deputy Chief Minister Chowna Mein described the Emergency as more than just a historical episode, and called it a “warning, a responsibility, and a lesson” that should never be forgotten. As a part of observance, the Governor inaugurated a photo exhibition aimed at raising public awareness about sanctity of the Constitution and need to preserve democratic institutions.

Earlier in the day, State’s WCD Minister Dasanglu Pul flagged off a Walk-in Rally from IG Park to mark the occasion. Chief Minister Pema Khandu observed Samvidhan Hatya Diwas at DC Office in Tawang district.

In a historic moment for the country, Indian astronaut Shubhanshu Shukla took off in to space today on Axiom-4 mission from Kennedy Space Centre at Florida in United States at 12.01 pm Indian Standard Time. Shukla is the first Indian in over four decades to be in space after Rakesh Sharma. The other astronauts are Sławosz Uznański from Poland, Tibor Kapu from Hungary and Peggy Whitson from the US, who will be on 14-day scientific mission in Low Earth Orbit (LEO).The Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO) said, Axiom-4 will dock with International Space Station at 4:30 PM IST tomorrow.

Eight hundred 18 Indian nationals have returned home from Israel till now as part of Operation Sindhu. Union Minister of State for Labour, Employment and MSME Shobha Karandlaje received 224 Indian nationals who returned to India from Israel on an Indian Air Force aircraft this morning. The Ministry of External Affairs said that, safety and security of Indian nationals remain a priority for the Government.

The Meteorological Centre Itanagar (MCI) today forecast that 12 districts including Itanagar are in yellow alert zone. These districts will receive thunderstorm with lightning and heavy rain very likely at isolated places.

Union Agriculture Minister Shiv Raj Chouhan virtually conducted a comprehensive review of Viksit Krishi Sankalp Abhiyan yesterday. State Agriculture & Allied Minister Gabriel D Wangsu informed that in Arunachal, altogether 2,254 villages were covered against target of

1,380. About 55.88 percent of women out of 1 lakh 23 thousand 875 farmers have joined Viksit Krishi Sankalp Abhiyan.

The two-day training programme on Incident Response System (IRS) and Civil Defence Security Drills for District Level, organized by District Disaster Management Authority (DDMA), has started today at Conference Hall, DC Office in Yingkiong, Upper Siang district. The training aims to strengthen district-level response mechanisms and ensure coordinated action during emergencies and disasters.

The two day Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Camp, organized as part of Janjatiya Gaurav Varsh, concludes today at Doimukh Market Ground near SDO Office in Papum Pare district.

The Iranian Parliament today approved a bill suspending cooperation with the UN nuclear watchdog, International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA).

In the first semi final match of the Men's Hockey India Masters Cup, today, Tamil Nadu defeated Chandigarh by 3 goals. The second semi final will be played between Odisha and Maharashtra.
