The government has decided to extend the cut-off date for exercising the option for Unified Pension Scheme by three months till 30th September of this year. This cut-off date will apply for the eligible central government employees, retirees, and the legally wedded spouses of deceased retirees.

Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla yesterday said that the Estimates Committee of the Parliament has consistently contributed to budgetary reforms aimed at improving transparency and aligning expenditures with national development goals. United States President Donald Trump has announced that Iran and Israel have agreed to a complete and total ceasefire, which will come into effect in the coming hours. The announcement was made last night, shortly after an Iranian missile attack on a US airbase in Qatar. In a statement on Truth Social, Mr Trump said that the ceasefire would begin once both countries have wound down and completed their ongoing final missions. According to the statement, the ceasefire would be implemented in stages.

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh yesterday released a book titled Wings to Our Hopes - Volume 2 in New Delhi yesterday. This book contains the speeches delivered by President Droupadi Murmu between the period of August 2023 to July 2024. Speaking on the occasion, Defence Minister said, India took the historic action under the Operation Sindoor which injected fear in minds of terrorists.

On the occasion, Information and Broadcasting Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said the book will make the upcoming generations aware about the welfare thoughts of the President Droupadi Murmu.

Train services between south Assam, Tripura, Manipur and Mizoram and the rest of the country via Guwahati have been suspended since Monday evening amid landslides impacting the railway track in the New Haflong-Jatinga Lampur section of the Northeast Frontier Railway (NFR). NFR's Chief Public Relations Officer Kapinjal Kishore Sharma said, railway already engaged clear the debris has manpower to from the railway track.
