A delegation of Naga elders and leaders from various Naga tribal Hohos from Northeast India met Lord Boateng of Akyem and Wembley, Member of the House of Lords of the United Kingdom, on Wednesday. The meeting took place after Lord Boateng invited the Naga delegation which was in the UK to work with the Pitt Rivers Museum for repatriation of the Naga human remains. Lord Boateng was one of the key figures, alongside Baroness Black of Strome, in calling for a parliamentary debate in the House of Lords for preventing the sale and display of human body parts.

During the meeting, Lord Boateng said that no human remains should be treated as possessions, curiosity, or for profit as it is morally wrong and offensive. He also presented the official report on the Parliamentary debates held at the House of Lords. Meanwhile, each of the tribal leaders expressed their appreciation to Lord Boateng for his welcome and they spoke about the urgency of the repatriation of their ancestral remains to the Naga homeland.
