Nagaland Chief Minister Dr. Neiphiu Rio met with the Ambassador of Thailand to India, Chavanart Thangsumphant, and the Ambassador of Japan to India, ONO Keiichi, in New Delhi yesterday. In separate meetings with the Ambassadors, Dr. Rio discussed with the Thai Ambassador ways to strengthen ties between Nagaland and Thailand and further enhance bilateral relations. The Chief Minister and the Japanese Ambassador also reaffirmed their commitment to strengthening ties and advancing shared goals.

The newly christened Chümoukedima District Village Council Association, formerly known as the Chumoukedima Area Village Chairmen Association, has extended its full support to the state government's proposal to strictly enforce the Inner Line Permit (ILP) regime. Representing 56 village councils, the association has urged the government to adopt a hybrid ILP system, available both online and offline, making it more guarantor-friendly. It also called for extending ILPs for agricultural labourers to one year from 90 days. Appreciating the government's efforts to uphold Naga customary laws through the Fifth Amendment Rules, 2025, the councils called for urgent attention to concerns raised by the Nagaland Bar Association, and for clear rules on appointing and operating District Customary Courts. They recommended appointing retired Dobashis and renowned GBs to these roles. Other key demands included disbanding VDB Secretary Associations, enforcing the One Government, One Tax call, reviewing ceasefire ground rules, and posting key district officials such as a Project Officer, District Education Officer, and create or post District Sessions Judge for improve local governance and justice delivery.

The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) yesterday announced that Class 10 board exams will be held in two terms starting from next year. According to the new framework, the initial examination will take place in February which will be compulsory for all students. Meanwhile, the subsequent examination in May will be optional for those students who seek to enhance their performance. All passed students will be allowed to improve their performance in any of the three subjects out of Science, Mathematics, Social Science and languages. The results for the two phases will be announced in April and June, respectively.
