The Government has decided to conduct the Population Census – 2027 in two phases, along with the enumeration of castes. The first phase will be conducted in hilly and snow-hit areas of Jammu and Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand and Ladakh beginning 1st of October, 2026. The second phase covering other parts of the country will be held from 1st of March 2027. The last census was conducted in 2011 in two phases. The notification for the intent of conducting Population Census is likely to be published in the official gazette on 16th of this month. The process of Census begins with the issuance of the notification.

The government is working on building a consensus among all political parties to initiate the process to bring an impeachment motion against High Court judge Justice Yashwant Varma. A large stash of cash was recovered from the official residence of Justice Yashwant Varma in New Delhi a few months back. Talking to media in New Delhi, Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju said any discussion on corruption in the judiciary or anywhere has to be taken in the best interest of the nation.

higher education by 2035. Since 2014, the number of higher education institutions has jumped from 51,000 to over 70,000, with major expansions in IITs, IIMs, and AIIMS. The PM SHRI Yojana is upgrading 14,500 schools, focussing quality education, holistic development and 21st-century skills, while also serving as mentor institutions for neighboring schools. Alongside education, sports have emerged as a national priority. Under the Khelo India Movement, over 1,000 training centres have been opened and 3,000 young athletes receive annual support of 6.28 lakh rupees. The Target Olympic Podium Scheme (TOPS) supports India's top athletes with training, equipment, and international exposure. These efforts are paying off, India won 13 medals in the last two Olympics, and a record-breaking 29 medals at the Paris Paralympics. India isn't just teaching its youth to read and write, it's teaching them to dream big, run fast, and never stop)
