Over 142 crore trees have been planted across the country, contributing to carbon absorption and ecological restoration. India has also made significant strides in wildlife conservation. India now has at least 3,682 tigers, accounting for over 75 percent of the world's wild tiger population. India currently has 91 Ramsar sites, the highest in Asia. 13 Indian beaches have earned the prestigious Blue Flag certification, while schemes like Amrit Dharohar and MISHTI are advancing the preservation of wetlands and mangroves, crucial for climate

resilience. India's green transformation is more than a policy initiative — it is a people's movement, a planetary responsibility, and a promise to future generations.
