Aircraft Accident Investigation Bureau (AAIB) has initiated formal investigation into Air India plane crash in Ahmedabad. Civil Aviation Minister Ram Mohan Naidu said that the investigation will be done in line with international protocols set by the International Civil Aviation Organization.

NAIDU BYTE -

The Minister informed that the government is constituting a high-level committee comprising experts from multiple disciplines to examine the matter in detail. The committee will work to strengthen aviation safety and prevent such incidents in future. Air India has confirmed that 241 people on board its London-bound flight were killed when the aircraft crashed shortly after takeoff from the Ahmedabad airport yesterday. The Boeing 787-8 aircraft was carrying 242 passengers and crew members. The passengers comprised 169 Indian nationals, 53 British nationals, seven Portuguese nationals and one Canadian national. The dead included several people on the ground. Former Gujarat Chief Minister and BJP leader Vijay Rupani was among the dead. One passenger identified as Vishwash Kumar Ramesh survived the crash. Condolences from leaders across the world are pouring in for the people affected in the Ahmedabad plane crash incident.

Union Home Minister Minister Amit Shah visited Ahmedabad hours after the plane crash yesterday. He also held a meeting with Civil Aviation Minister Ram Mohan Naidu, Gujarat Chief Minister Bhupendra Patel, and senior officials to review the relief and rescue operations. Speaking to the media after the meeting, Mr Shah said that the entire nation is shocked by the unfortunate incident, and all citizens of the country stand in solidarity with the families who have lost their loved ones in this tragedy. He also confirmed that the Ministry of Civil Aviation has already initiated a formal investigation into the incident to determine its cause.

SHAH BYTE -

The Home Minister also visited the Trauma Centre at Ahmedabad Civil Hospital, where several of the injured are being treated. He reviewed the medical arrangements and interacted with doctors and officials overseeing emergency care.

The Nagaland Cabinet has decided to streamline the implementation of the Inner Line Permit (ILP) and to constitute a five-member Independent Commission to review the State's Reservation Policy in government employment.
