Lok Sabha MP S. Supongmeren Jamir yesterday held a meeting with the Kohima Deputy Commissioner, SDO (Civil) Jakhama and other officials to assess the ongoing landslide situation in Phesama village. The DC briefed on coordinated actions with the Phesama Village Council and affected landowners to restore the blocked road. The MP expressed concern over the disruption to commuters and urged upon expedited measures. The discussions also focused on challenges related to the bypass road connecting Packages 1 to 4. Officials assured that serious efforts were being made to resolve the issues by engaging with landowners, contractors, and NHIDCL. The MP emphasized upon time-bound action to ensure restoration of road connectivity.

The National Highway Village Councils Forum has voiced strong concerns over ceasefire violations and inaction of authorities following incidents of violence at Unity Village last month. The forum comprises 13 villages along the 4-lane National Highway 29. Addressing a press conference in Sovima today, forum Chairman Sebastian Zumvü, said a 6-hour business shutdown will be observed until noon tomorrow to express condemnation of the incident and inaction of the Ceasefire Supervisory Board.

The Forum has also submitted a memorandum to the Centre's Interlocutor for Naga Peace Talks, urging strict enforcement of the law, and early return of peace to the region.
