Prime Minister Narendra Modi has arrived in Cyprus on the first leg of his three-nation tour. He was received at Larnaka International Airport by Cyprus President Nikos Christodoulides. The two leaders will have a business roundtable with Indian and Cypriot entrepreneurs at Lemesos. Tomorrow, Prime Minister Modi will hold formal bilateral talks with President Christodoulides in Nicosia. Discussions are expected to cover key areas such as trade, investment, education, digital cooperation, and regional security. The leaders are also likely to exchange views on broader international developments, including the India-EU partnership, the India-Middle East-Europe Economic Corridor.



In the Ahmedabad plane crash in Gujarat, a total of 32 deceased have had their DNA samples matched so far, and 14 bodies have been handed over to their families. Additional Superintendent of Civil Hospital Dr. Rajnish Patel said that four of the deceased are from Ahmedabad, two from Vadodara, one from Kheda, one from Aravalli, one from Botad, four from Mehsana, and one from Udaipur. The bodies of the deceased whose DNA samples have been matched are being handed over to their families. the body of former Gujarat Chief Minister, Vijay Rupani has also been identified after DNA testing.

A team of Kohima Police from Chiephobozou Police Station today successfully intercepted a dumper truck reported stolen from neighbouring Assam. A press release from the SP, Kohima state that the accused driver operating the stolen vehicle has been apprehended and is in police custody. It informed that a team of Police from Assam is en route to Kohima to take possession of the truck and the driver. The release added that the successful interception highlights the vigilance and efficiency of the Chiephobozou Police Station team and underscores the ongoing coordination between Kohima Police and their Assam counterparts in combating cross-border crime.



Science and Technology Minister Dr Jitendra Singh today announced a policy reforms to enhance the Ease of Innovation and Ease of Doing Research, providing long-awaited relief to innovators, researchers, scholars, scientists and institutions across the country. Addressing a press conference in New Delhi, Dr. Singh said that such path-breaking decisions could not have been possible without the personal indulgence and support of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. The announcement follows extensive consultations led by the Principal Scientific Adviser's office, drawing insights from 13 IITs and multiple research bodies across India. The ministry has also revised key financial thresholds under the General Financial Rules (GFR).



Union Home Minister Amit Shah handed over appointment letters to over 60 thousand newly recruited constables of the Uttar Pradesh Police at a grand ceremony in Lucknow today. Speaking on the occasion, Union Home Minister said, out of the new recruits in Uttar Pradesh Police Force, more than 12 thousand are women. He said, around 25 crore people were lifted out of poverty in the country in the past 11 years of the Narendra Modi government.

Union Minister for New and Renewable Energy Pralhad Joshi has said that India's wind energy capacity witnessed a rise of more than 10.5 per cent to 51.5 gigawatts against 46.42 gigawatts last year. On the occasion of Global Wind Day today, Mr. Joshi said, India's renewable energy sector has witnessed unprecedented growth. These officers will undergo a week of hands-on training in leveraging modern geospatial technologies for effective urban property surveys at four Centers Of Excellence in Pune, Guwahati, Chandigarh and Mysuru. The second batch will be inaugurated by Department of Land Resources Secretary, Manoj Joshi virtually across the four Centres Of Excellence. The Ministry of Rural Development said, the training aims to equip ULB officers and field staff with the technical and practical skills required to oversee high-accuracy urban land surveys under the NAKSHA programme.
