A dark pattern is a deceptive user interface design used by digital platforms to mislead or manipulate consumers into making choices they did not intend.

India Meteorological Department (IMD) has forecast heavy rainfall over Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Marathwada, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura today. According to IMD, rainfall activity over the Northeast region is likely to continue for the next seven days.
