**UNDERPLAY**: Bandhas and Mudras are practices associated with Prānāyāma. They are viewed as the higher yogic practices that mainly adopt certain physical gestures along with control over respiration. This further facilitates control over mind and paves way for higher Yogic attainment. However, practice of dhyāna, which moves one towards self-realisation and leads one to transcendence, is considered the essence of Yoga Sādhana. Heavy rain continued to pound the northeastern states disrupting road transport and train services. Torrential monsoon rains have claimed at least 27 lives across the northeast. Authorities have issued alerts across the region as more rain are expected. Union Home Minister Amit Shah spoke to Chief Ministers of Assam, Manipur, Sikkim, and Arunachal Pradesh yesterday and offered centre's full support. Rescue teams, including the NDRF, SDRF, fire services, and local authorities, are working round the clock to help those affected. With more rain expected, officials are on high alert and continuing efforts to reduce damage and deliver relief. Out of 27 victims, nine died in Arunachal Pradesh, six in Meghalaya, five each in Assam and Mizoram, and one each in Tripura and Nagaland.
