## NEWS IN ORDER:-

### **PM:**

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has said the country has witnessed rapid transformations across diverse sectors in the last 11 years, powered by the collective participation of 140 crore Indians. As the NDA government at the Centre completed 11 years in office, Prime Minister Modi emphasized that, under the guiding principle of Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas, Sabka Vishwas, Sabka Prayas, the Centre has delivered pathbreaking reforms with speed, scale and sensitivity. In a social media post, Mr Modi said that the country today is not just the fastest-growing major economy, but also a key global voice on pressing issues like climate action and digital innovation. He said that India looks ahead with hope, confidence and a renewed resolve to build a Viksit.

### **AIRLIFT:**

At least 28 persons, stranded at Chaten in north Sikkim, and 20 Army personnel were airlifted, as the road connectivity in the region had been snapped due to multiple landslides triggered by heavy rain. A chopper evacuated 28 civilians, comprising minors, tourist taxi drivers and government officials, from Chaten in the first sortie, while 20 Army personnel returned to Pakyong Greenfield Airport in another trip. The MI-17 helicopter also transported essential supplies for Army personnel stationed at Chaten. The Sikkim Government arranged a helicopter to provide immediate relief and safe evacuation of those affected by the landslides in the region after receiving a distress call from them. North Sikkim has been hit by multiple landslides triggered by heavy rain, disrupting road and telecommunication connectivity there.

### **CRISIS:**

The former Chief Minister and N. Biren Singh along with Rajya Sabha MP- Leishemba Sanajaoba yesterday left Imphal for New Delhi, where they are going to meet central leaders to discuss the ongoing crisis in the State. The Valley districts of Manipur have been witnessing widespread protests since Saturday night after a leader of Arambai Tenggol was arrested by CBI in connection to a case related to ethnic violence in Manipur since May 2023. After the fresh violence in the State, the internet and mobile data services have been banned and prohibition under Section 163 of BNSS has been promulgated in five valley districts of Manipur since Saturday night. Speaking to media persons at Imphal Airport, the State BJP leader N. Biren Singh said that the situation of Manipur as on date is very critical and in such a period, he appealed to people to remain calm and avoid violence during the protest.

### **POLICY:**

The Meghalaya government is set to roll out generous subsidies and discounts under the Meghalaya Film Tourism Policy 2025, offering financial incentives to filmmakers who choose Shillong and other locations in the state as their filming destinations. According to the policy, the Government will provide up to Rs 1 crore or 25% of the total cost of

production, whichever is less, for the first 10 films shot in Meghalaya. To qualify, at least 75% of the total shooting days must take place within the state. For the next 10 films, the Government will offer up to Rs 75 lakh or 25% of the COP, whichever is less. In addition, a sum of Rs 1 crore will be allocated annually to three local filmmakers.

**CRIME:**

Meghalaya Tourism Minister, Paul Lyngdoh has said that the people of the state were relieved, when the state police were able to crack the high profile murder case of Raja Raghuvanshi, who was killed during a honeymoon trip in Sohra in East Khasi Hills District. Addressing media persons in Shillong following the arrest of four accused, including the victim’s wife Sonam Raghuvanshi, Paul Lyngdoh yesterday called it a case of triangle love and contract killers. “The confidence of the Government placed on the police was vindicated”, Paul Lyndoh said. The Special Investigation Team, along with local mountaineering and rock-climbing associations and the people of Sohra, overcame tough terrain and monsoon conditions to recover the victim’s body and solve the case within just seven days.” Sonam Raghuvanshi surrendered at the Nandganj Police Station in Ghazipur district, Uttar Pradesh, Paul Lyngdoh added, adding that FIRs have filed and legal action will be taken against those responsible in spreading misinformation.
