NEWS IN ORDER:-

TENURE:

Nagaland's Deputy Chief Minister Y. Patton said the tenure of the Modi Government is becoming a golden era of "Sankalp Ki Siddhi" for a developed and self-reliant India, which will be written in golden letters in India's history. Addressing a press conference at the BJP Head Office, Kohima, on Viksit Bharat ka Amrit Kaal: Seva, Sushasan, Garib Kalyan ke 11 Saal, he said in this 11-year journey, Prime Minister has dedicated himself to uplifting the hard work, sacrifices, and dreams of 140 crore Indians. Mr. Patton said the era of governance under Modi has laid a strong foundation for India's future, where progress has been driven by technology, welfare for poor prioritised, governance redefined as a form of public service; and a participative approach has been adopted.

RAILWAY:

History has been made in Mizoram's infrastructural development on Tuesday with the successful commissioning and Commissioner of Railway Safety authorisation of the newly constructed Broad Gauge line from Hortoki to Sairang, chief public relation officer of Northeast Frontier Railway (NFR) Kapinjal Kishore Sharma said. "This milestone completes the entire 51.38 km Bairabi–Sairang New Line Railway Project, bringing direct rail connectivity to the state capital, Aizawl, for the first time. The final 33.864 km stretch from Hortoki to Sairang was thoroughly inspected by Sumeet Singhal, Commissioner of Railway Safety, Northeast Frontier Circle, between June 6 and 10." The Bairabi to Hortoki section had already been commissioned in July last year and with the completion of the final leg, Mizoram is now fully integrated into the national railway network, he said.

INITIATIVE:

After heavy monsoon rainfall disrupted the ongoing Viksit Krishi Sankalp Abhiyan for days, the nationwide outreach initiative again resumed in Mizoram with over 700 villages being covered across the state, joint director of state agriculture & farmers' welfare and VKSA Nodal Officer B. Ramnunsanga said. The VKSA campaign was scheduled from May 29 to June 12 2025, during the Pre-Kharif season. However, massive monsoon downpours forced the officials to halt the campaign and resumed it only from June 5. The officials have covered 19,174 farmers including 8,211 women in 217 villages as of June 5 and the period may have to be extended.

CURFEW:

In Manipur, curfew has been relaxed from 5 am to 5 pm in five valley districts from today until further notice. However, the ban on internet and mobile data services in these five districts remained in force till the filing of this report. The District Magistrates of five districts- Imphal West, Imphal East, Thoubal, Kakching and Bishnupur clamped curfew from Saturday midnight under Section 163 of BNSS after widespread protests erupted in these districts. The protestors were demanding to release a leader of Arambai Tenggol who had been arrested by CBI in connection to a case related to ethnic violence in the State. Meanwhile, the Meetei outfit- Arambai Tenggol had also called off the 10 days total shutdown in the State from yesterday afternoon.

AKASHVANI:

In Meghalaya, Akashwani Community Radio Station, Nongstoin, marked its Silver Jubilee yesterday, celebrating 25 years of dedicated service to the community. The event was held at the CRS Nongstoin premises and was graced by the presence of Ashish Bhatnagar, Additional Director General (A, BO & CA) of Akashwani and Doordarshan. Addressing the gathering, Ashish Bhatnagar highlighted the inclusive mission of Akashwani, stating, "Akashwani is not meant for VIPs or those at the top. It is for the common people and for everyone." In Nagaland, Akashvani Community Radio Station Tuensang celebrated its Silver Jubilee today, marking 25 years of dedicated service to the community. Gracing the event as Guest of Honour, Deputy Commandant 3rd NAP Tuensang, Hongkin Chang, lauded the service rendered by the station especially in remote areas.
