India and the Maldives today signed 4 MoUs and 3 agreements. They are in the field of Fisheries and Aquaculture, Digital Solution and recognition of Indian Pharmacopoeia. Prime Minister Narendra Modi handed over 3 thousand 300 social housing units in Hulhumale built under India's Buyers' Credit facilities. The Prime Minister also inaugurated Roads and Drainage system project in Addu city and 6 High Impact Community Development Projects in Maldives. Meanwhile, India has extended 4,850 Crore rupees Line of Credit to Maldives. This financial assistance is expected to fund key infrastructure and developmental projects across the country.

Both the Houses were adjourned for the day following the ruckus created by the Opposition over various issues. Governor Lt. General (Retd.) KT Parnaik interacted with the Indian Army Officers at Dinjan Military Station, Assam today. Delegates from the Commonwealth War Graves Commission (CWGC), Delhi meticulously surveyed the World War II sites in Arunachal, including WWII Cemetery, Laal Pool, Hamilton Bridge, Hell Gate, and the historic stretch of the Old Stilwell Road leading to Pangsau Pass yesterday. The mission was designed to assess the current state of these monumental sites and identify areas for necessary upgrades. In the meantime, the CWGC delegates have assured to dedicate all efforts in retrieving comprehensive facts and figures about the cemetery from the CWGC Headquarters in Britain.

Governor Lt. General (Retd.) KT Parnaik on behalf of the people of the State paid tributes to the brave sons of India who laid down their lives during the Kargil War on the historic occasion of Kargil Vijay Diwas. In his message, the Governor said that Kargil Vijay Diwas is more than a commemoration of victory. It is a powerful reminder of the extraordinary courage, selfless sacrifice, and unwavering patriotism of our armed forces.

The Arunachal Pradesh State Commission for Women team led by its Chairperson Yalem Taga Burang visited the One Stop Centre (OSC) located at Zoo Road Officer Colony, Itanagar today. The team made their first official visit to take stock of functioning of the OSC. While interacting with the staff, the team was informed on the current challenges faced by the centre. In the meantime, the APSCW urged the State Government to look into the matter on priority.
