Governor Lt. General KT Parnaik (Retd.) today handed over a Grant-in-Aid cheque of Rs. 10 Lakh to Deepak Nabam Living Home, Itanagar and another cheque of Rs. 5 Lakh to Mother's Home, Lekhi Village. The Governor lauded the exemplary service rendered by organizations like Deepak Nabam Living Home and Mother's Home, recognizing them as shining examples of humanity in action. He appreciated the selfless dedication of their teams, noting that such efforts not only heal lives but also restore hope, dignity, and a sense of belonging to those who need it the most. The Governor said that the State and Central Governments are always with them to take up their benevolent mission ahead through various programmes.

Chief Secretary Manish Kumar attended the launch of the Online Building Permission System (OBPS) at the Civil Secretariat, Itanagar today. The OBPS is a digital platform for obtaining building permits for Arunachal Pradesh. While congratulating the Town Planning Department on the achievement, the CS in a social media post said that the OBPS marks a significant step toward the Ease of Doing Business by simplifying and expediting the building permit process, minimizing delays and paperwork. He further informed that the OBPS will soon be operated by Urban Local Bodies across the state.

In a notification issued today, the Papum Pare District Administration has directed all administrative officers to strengthen vigilance during the issuance of both temporary and permanent Inner Line Permits. Further, all administrative offices across the district have been instructed to conduct routine checking drives within their respective circles and sub-divisions and work in coordination with the Police Department.
