Prime Minister Narendra Modi has said his government is committed to bringing a significant change in the lives of farmers. In a social media post, Mr Modi said the Prime Minister Dhan-Dhanya Krishi Yojna approved by Cabinet yesterday is a step in this direction. He said this will not only increase crop production in the districts that have been lagging in the agricultural sector but also boost the income of farmers.

Advisor for Agriculture Mhathung Yanthan said the state government is formulating a new Agriculture Policy aimed at boosting productivity, market linkages, farmer welfare, and post-harvest infrastructure. Speaking during a field visit at Chiethu, Kohima, yesterday, he also highlighted ELEMENT-a World Bankfunded project supporting forest-based economic opportunities. Chiechama Village, he noted, is among 225 villages selected under the initiative. Mr Yanthan encouraged farmers to be proactive, collaborative, and entrepreneurial in approach. Sovima Village Council Chairman, Sebastian Zumvu, meanwhile, highlighted Chiethu's scenic beauty and agricultural potential for agrotourism.

In Tsungiki village of Wokha district, a heartwarming initiative is lighting up lives—quite literally. A night school for senior citizens, launched on April 29 this year under the PRI—CBO Convergence Project and supported by the Beti Bachao Beti Padhao scheme, is giving elderly villagers a second chance at education. Over 40 learners aged 60 and above, including 86-year-old Njano, attend classes twice a week at the village community hall after their fieldwork. The program, spearheaded by local Self Help Groups as part of their Village Poverty Reduction Plan, teaches basic reading, writing, and math using nursery-level materials. Most of the learners are entering a classroom for the first time, while the pace is slow, the impact is profound. Learners say writing their own names instead of using thumbprints has given them dignity and confidence.
