Prime Minister Narendra Modi has set a target to scale up bilateral trade with Brazil from the existing 12.2 billion to 20 billion dollars in the next five years. Speaking at a Joint Press Conference with the Brazilian President Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva during the state visit to Brazil in Brasilia yesterday, Mr. Modi said that both the countries will work closely to improve market access for Indian exporters. Mr Modi announced plans to enable Unified Payments Interface adoption in Brazil on the lines of India's digital payments infrastructure. He identified key sectors for enhanced bilateral cooperation including agriculture, food processing, digital public infrastructure and space technology.

On this occasion, Prime Minister Narendra Modi was conferred with Brazil's highest civilian award, the Grand Collar of the National Order of the Southern Cross. In the final leg of his five-nation visit, Prime Minister Narendra Modi will reach Windhoek in Namibia today.



The Five Tribes Committee on Review of Reservation Policy said that it will go ahead with its sit-in protest today. The committee comprises representatives from five major Naga tribes—Angami, Ao, Lotha, Rengma, and Sumi.
