Former NITI Aayog CEO Amitabh Kant yesterday lauded Unified Payments Interface (UPI)for becoming the world's leading real-time payment system, processing a staggering 650 million transactions daily to dislodge Visa from the top rank. With the win, Sinner secures his fourth Grand Slam title, now only missing Roland Garros to complete the career Grand Slam.
