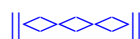

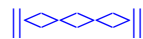

Nagaland State Disaster Management Authority, NSDMA has said that extreme monsoon weather occurrences have begun causing widespread damages throughout the State. Commissioner and Secretary, NSDMA, Lhouchalie Viya in a press release today informed that there reports of damages to houses, roads, bridges, breast wall of roads, paddy fields and jhum cultivations. Flooding was reported from various colonies in Dimapur such as SM Colony, Ragailong colony, Namgalong colony, Super Market, K Sachu colony, Ekhyoyan Village, Walford colony and Model colony Purana Bazaar. Mr. Viya said relief camps for the displaced victims have been set up by DDMA Dimapur and HG, CD & SDRF have also been actively involved in search and rescue duties. In Chumoukedima district, flooding was reported from Tenyiphe village, Chekiye village, Ward 10 near DC office, Virazouma village and Neiphrolie colony. The district also reported flooding at Singrijan village, Khopanala village, Sovima village, 173rd CRPF Camp beside Airport, Thilixu village and Naga United village. Damages to infrastructure due to incessant rains have also been reported in Chumoukedima district. Niuland district reported flooding incident in Kuhuboto village, New Showuba, Nizhevi, Lotovi, Suhoi, Nihokhu, Hovishe, Ghokuto, Toshiho, Khehoyi and Anato village. In Kohima, a retaining wall collapsed below Civil Secretariat damaging two vehicles and blocking the road to several offices. Instances of flooding in town areas was also reported. NSDMA said the road connecting Mon to Longleng district have been completely cut off by landslide at Yongam Village on 4th July. In Chanka village under Wokha district, flash flood destroyed paddy fields. In Mokokchung district, landslide was reported from Changki village damaging the main road and water pipeline. Landslide incident was also reported form Longkong village. In Tuensang district, National Highway 202 was fully cut off at Chare Town. Commissioner and Secretary, NSDMA, Lhouchalie Viya said DDMA Tuensang assisted in transporting stranded or sick passengers from Chare to Tuensang. The road connecting Chare to Mokokchung district was also cut off by landslide at multiple locations. Mr. Viya said bailey bridge between Chare to Mokokchung is also on the verge of collaps due to the strong current of river.



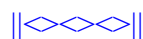
Prime Minister Narendra Modi has said that no country should weaponise critical minerals, technology and supply chains to further its selfish gain. In an outreach session during the BRICS Summit in Rio de Janeiro, he said, in addition to greater cooperation in critical minerals and technology, there is a need to focus on securing and making their supply chains resilient. He said that the progress and well-being of people largely depend on technology, especially Artificial Intelligence, in the 21st century. The Prime Minister added that on one hand, AI can greatly improve everyday life, while on the other hand, it also raises concerns about risks, ethics, and bias. 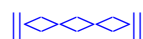
District Disaster Management Authority, DDMA has decided to submit a comprehensive report to the state government to work out modalities for permanent solution on the flash floods. To extend immediate assistance three relief camps have been set up at BSNL quarters in Walford area, SM colony and Namgalong colony. All together 844 individuals including children, old-age, sick, special child, infant, were safely rescued and relocated to designated relief camps. The district administration is coordinating with the DDMA and the State Disaster Response Force is continuously monitoring the situation. SDRF team used one rescue boat and 25 personnel including trained divers, to evacuate residents trapped in flooded houses and low-lying streets.



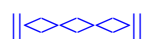
