PM

Responding to a post by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on X, Mr Modi said Meghalaya stands as a blueprint for a resilient and self-reliant India with strong government support and vibrant community spirit.

PARLIAMENT

Ahead of the Monsoon Session of Parliament, the government held an all-party meeting to ensure smooth functioning of both the Houses of Parliament yesterday. The meeting was convened by the government to seek cooperation from opposition parties for the smooth conduct of the

session. Floor leaders of different political parties representing the Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha attended the meeting. Union Minister and Leader of the House in the Rajya Sabha Jagat Praksah Nadda chaired the meeting in which Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijju, Ministers of State for Parliamentary Affairs Arjun Ram Meghwal and Dr L Murugan were present.

LAWS

Tripura Chief Minister Dr. Manik Saha has underscored the transformative nature of India's newly implemented criminal laws, describing them as victim-friendly, technology-driven, and committed to delivering timely justice. Addressing a workshop on investigation and prosecution under new criminal laws & the NDPS Act at Agartala, the Chief Minister highlighted key features of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, and Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam, which came into effect nationwide on the first of July, last year. He said these new criminal laws reflect a modern approach to justice where victims are empowered, and processes are streamlined. The Chief Minister reiterated that a victim can now file an FIR from any corner of the country using electronic communication, without having to visit a police station physically.

YATRA

The annual 38-day Shri Amarnath Ji Yatra that commenced on the 3rd of this month, is going on peacefully and seamlessly, from twin routes of Nunwan Pahalgam Base Camp in South Kashmir's Anantnag district and Baltal Base Camp in Central Kashmir's Ganderbal district. The Yatra will conclude on 9th August on the occasion of Raksha Bandhan. During the first 17 days of the 38-day Shri Amarnath Ji Yatra, the number of Yatris has surpassed the three-lakh mark, who had darshan of Shiv Lingam at the Holy Cave, till yesterday evening. Yatris from across the country are satisfied with all kinds of arrangements & facilities besides multi-tier security arrangements along twin routes of Baltal and Pahalgam towards Holy Cave.

MILK

In a significant boost to Assam's dairy sector, Dr Himanta Biswa Sarma, Chief Minister of Assam yesterday participated in the Bhoomi Poojan ceremony organised by West Assam Milk Producers' Cooperative Union Ltd for the expansion of Purabi Dairy plant at Panjabari, Guwahati. The upgraded facility will double the plant's milk processing capacity from 1.5 lakh litres per day to 3 lakh litres per day. Jogen Mohan, Minister of Cooperation, Government of Assam; Krishnendu Paul, Minister of

Animal Husbandry & Veterinary, Government of Assam; Ravi Kota, Chief Secretary, Government of Assam; Dr Meenesh Shah, Chairman, National Dairy Development Board and other dignitaries graced the occasion.
