NEWS IN ORDER:-

NAGALAND:

In Nagaland, more than 200 vehicles carrying evicted illegal immigrants from Assam, attempting to enter Niuland District, were intercepted and deported at the Niuland check post. The operation was carried out by the District Administration, Police, CRPF, and village authorities at various check posts across Niuland District, bordering Assam. The Nagaland government is on high alert following the eviction drive being conducted in neighbouring Assam against illegal immigrants. The government has already directed district administrations and law enforcement agencies across the state, particularly in districts sharing a border with Assam to remain vigilant against any attempted influx of illegal immigrants. The state government emphasized that this proactive approach is essential for maintaining law and order and safeguarding the demographic integrity of the state.

ORDER:

In Meghalaya, all Deputy Commissioners have been directed to keep vigilance and take necessary measures to ensure the potential influx is kept in check and law and order is maintained. An order was issued yesterday by Additional Chief Secretary in-charge Home (Political) Department, Shakil P. Ahammed in view of the ongoing eviction drive against illegal settlers undertaken by the Government of Assam and to prevent possible influx of the displaced individuals to the State.

MANIPUR:

In Manipur, a high alert was issued and the district authorities have been directed to tighten surveillance across all international, interstate, and inter-district borders in light of escalating concerns over a potential influx of illegal migrants from neighbouring countries. An official advisory circulated yesterday to all Deputy Commissioners and Superintendents of Police in the state instructed to maintain the utmost vigil and establish a robust mechanism to prevent illegal border crossings.

DoNER-SUMMIT:

The Ministry for Development of North Eastern Region organized 'Rising Northeast Investors Summit, 2025' to catalyze trade and investment in the North Eastern Region. This information was given by the Union Minister of State in-charge Ministry for Development of North Eastern Region, Dr. Sukanta Majumdar in a written reply to a question in the Lok Sabha yesterday. Collectively, the Summit and its pre-event roadshows garnered investment interests of 4.48 lakh crore rupees through Memoranda of Understanding, letters of intent, and qualified leads from private investors, public-sector undertakings, and major industrial conglomerates. State Governments are actively engaged with all the investors for grounding of these MoUs. The State Governments promote the adoption of low-carbon technologies and environmentally sustainable practices to achieve economic development while preserving ecological integrity in the ecologically sensitive North Eastern Region.

BSF:

Acting on a specific tip-off, vigilant troops of the 22nd Battalion BSF in Meghalaya launched a joint operation with police, resulting in the interception of five pickup trucks transporting a total of 76 cattle—43 alive and 33 dead—in extremely inhumane and unhygienic conditions. The operation also led to the apprehension of seven Indian nationals involved in the illegal act. Three walkie-talkie sets were recovered from the apprehended individuals, indicating their coordinated efforts and links with an organized smuggling network. The accused were using these wireless devices to communicate and coordinate the movement of vehicles which is a common tactic employed by cross-border smugglers. All the seized items and individuals have been handed over to the concerned police authorities for further investigation and legal action.
