The Government has approved the Tato-II hydroelectric project with the capacity of 700 megawatt. Briefing media in New Delhi today about the Cabinet decision, Information and Broadcasting Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said that this project will be built in Shi Yomi district of Arunachal Pradesh and will be constructed within six years. He emphasized that this project will provide the stable source of electricity in the region, and boost regional development.

Welcoming the decision, Deputy Chief Minister Chowna Mein in a social media post said that the project will not only transform Arunachal Pradesh's power sector but also drive infrastructure development, create employment opportunities, and enhance the socio-economic landscape of the region.

Governor Lt Gen KT Parnaik (Retd) and Chief Minister Pema Khandu today inaugurated the Tiranga Mahotsav at a function held at the State Banquet Hall, Itanagar. As part of the nationwide Har Ghar Tiranga campaign, the dignitaries also opened a Tiranga Mela and attended a Tiranga Concert. National Flags were distributed to representatives from different districts participating in the event.
