President Droupadi Murmu today asserted that India is well on the path of becoming a developed economy by 2047. In her address to the nation on the eve of the 79th Independence Day, President Murmu attributed this to the all-round economic growth complemented by social sector initiatives. She said the nation is marching ahead during the Amrit Kaal and every citizen is contributing to the best of their ability. President Murmu expressed belief that youth, women and the communities that had for long remained on the margins will lead to Viksit Bharat. The President termed the killing of innocent citizens in the Pahalgam terror attack as cowardly and utterly inhuman. She said India responded in a decisive manner and with steely resolve by launching Operation Sindoor which showed that country's armed forces are prepared to meet any eventuality. President Murmu lauded armed forces for destroying terrorist hubs across the border with strategic clarity and technical capability.

A total of 1090 Personnel of Police, Fire, Home Guard, Civil Defence and Correctional Services have been awarded Gallantry and Service Medals on the occasion of Independence Day 2025. The Ministry of Home Affairs said, 233 personnel have been awarded the Medal for Gallantry, 99 personnel awarded the President's Medal for Distinguished Service and 758 personnel awarded the Medal for Meritorious Service. The Border Security Force has informed that on the occasion of Independence Day, sixteen Brave Seema Praharis will be awarded Gallantry Medals for their conspicuous bravery and unmatched valour, for being resolute and steadfast during Operation Sindoor.

On the eve of India's 79th Independence Day, Raj Bhavan, Itanagar has announced the conferment of the Arunachal Pradesh Governor's Citation to the National Institute of Mountaineering and Adventure Sports, Dirang, the 2nd Battalion of the Dogra Regiment, the 16th Battalion of the Jammu & Kashmir Light Infantry, 4 Corps Signal Regiment, 305 Field Hospital and the 667 Army Aviation Squadron. The initiative aimed at promoting the District Administration's campaign of maintaining the region as a 'No Plastic Zone'.
