Proceedings of the Lok Sabha and the Rajya Sabha continued to be marred by the opposition protest over the Special Intensive Revision exercise conducted in Bihar and other issues on the fourth day of this week. Due to the opposition ruckus, both the Houses have been adjourned for the day. Amid the noisy scene, the House passed the Manipur Goods and Services Tax (Amendment) Bill 2025 and the Manipur Appropriation (No 2) Bill 2025.

The Election Commission today issued the notification for filing the nomination for the Vice-Presidential election. Nominations for the office of Vice President can be filed till 21st of this month and election will be held on 9th of September. The election is necessitated following resignation of Jagdeep Dhankhar from the post of Vice-President last month. This will be the 17th Vice Presidential election.

The Meteorological Centre Itanagar has issued an orange alert for East Kameng, Kurung Kumey, Lower Subansiri, Papumpare, West Siang, Lower Siang, Namsai, Tirap and Longding district in Arunachal Pradesh. MCI has predicted thunderstorm with lightning and very heavy rainfall very likely at isolated places. Additionally, a yellow alert has also been issued for 14 districts.
