Chief Justice of India B.R. Gavai said that the judiciary, executive, and legislature exist to deliver justice to the last citizen of the country. Stressing the need for a calibrated and coordinated effort among these pillars, he said every step must be taken to ensure that justice is delivered at the earliest and at the least cost. He was speaking after inaugurating the newly constructed Court Building of the Gauhati High Court's Itanagar Permanent Bench at Naharlagun today. Mr. Gavai said that despite facing several crisis over the past 75 years after independence, the nation has remained strong, united, and is on the path to becoming a developed country. He said this was only possible by the strength of the Indian Constitution. The Chief Justice of India also added that North-East is one of the most important parts of India, and said that the Constitution provides special provisions to preserve and safeguard the tribal communities of the region. Union Minister Kiren Rijiju and Arjun Ram Meghwal, Chief Minister Pema Khandu, Deputy Chief Minister Chowna Mein along with a host of dignitaries were also present on the occasion.

Chief Minister Pema Khandu has termed the new building inauguration of the Gauhati High Court's Itanagar Permanent Bench as a momentous day in the judicial history of Arunachal Pradesh and India, emphasizing that the state-of-the-art facility is not only a boost to the judiciary but also a symbol of hope, accessibility, and unwavering pursuit of justice. The Chief Minister credited the achievement to the collaborative efforts of the Gauhati High Court, members of the Bar, State Government officials and all stakeholders including the state PWD and the contractor. Highlighting the state's progress in judicial infrastructure, Khandu noted that Arunachal Pradesh has expanded from just two courts in 2016 to 33 functional courts today, with 8 new courts added recently and 463 new posts created in the District Judiciary.

After arriving in Bengaluru today, he flagged off the Vande Bharat train service between Bengaluru and Belagavi. He also virtually flagged off Vande Bharat services between Amritsar and
