NEWS IN ORDER:-

PRESIDENT'S RULE:

The Parliament has given its nod to the statutory resolution regarding the extension of President's rule in Manipur for a further period of six months with effect from the 13th of this month. The Rajya Sabha adopted the statutory resolution through voice vote yesterday and the Lok Sabha had already given its approval to the statutory resolution last week. Union Minister of State for Home Affairs, Nityanand Rai moved the resolution seeking approval of the House for the extension of President's rule, which was imposed in Manipur on 13th February 2025. Replying to a discussion on the resolution, Rai said that since the imposition of President' rule, only one incident of violence took place in which one person lost his life. He added that not a single person lost life in the last four months in the state.

CULTURE:

Tripura Chief Minister Dr. Manik Saha has emphasized that culture plays a vital role in attaining mental and spiritual peace, and efforts must be made to showcase the state's rich and diverse traditional heritage on a global platform. Speaking at the first meeting of the reconstituted State-Level Cultural Advisory Committee in Agartala yesterday, the Chief Minister said, "Culture is the ornament of a society." Dr. Saha, who also holds the Information and Cultural Affairs portfolio, serves as the Chairman of the 39-member committee. The committee is tasked with guiding the state government in organizing cultural festivals, conducting artist workshops, and promoting various cultural initiatives.

FLORICULTURE:

Meghalaya Chief Minister, Conrad K. Sangma yesterday announced 240 crore rupees for Floriculture Mission 1.0 over the next three years, aiming to make the state a floriculture hub of the North East. Launched in March 2024, the mission targets 3,000 farmers, offering a 7 lakh rupees subsidy covering inputs, infrastructure, and training. During his visit to Mawkriah in East Khasi Hills district, Sangma highlighted that nearly 500 farmers have already benefitted and projected a direct profit of 600 crore rupees. (with byte)

WATER BILL:

Arunachal Pradesh Chief Minister, Pema Khandu yesterday launched the 'Water Bill' app of the department of Public Health Engineering & Water Sanitation for Itanagar Capital Region, a pilot project aimed to bring essential public service closer to the people. Addressing the gathering, Khandu informed that the pilot project is a part of a larger vision to bring digital systems for water connections, billing, and grievance redressal to every District Headquarters in Arunachal Pradesh. Meanwhile, the Chief Minister took stock of the department's ongoing projects, future endeavours and departmental issues and assured the state government's support with funds and manpower.

WORKING HOURS:

In Manipur, the State government has ordered all factories not to allow women to work in any factory in the State beyond the hours of 10 PM of the preceding night to 5 AM of the next morning, except some conditions, under clause (b) of sub-section (1) of section 66 of the Factories Act, 1948. According to a notification issued yesterday by the Department of Textiles, Commerce & Industries, all factories should obtain a written consent from a woman worker to work beyond the hours of 7 PM. It directed all occupiers to arrange adequate lighting and CCTV camera surveillance not only inside the factory but also surrounding the factory and all places where female workers may move out of necessity in the course of work.

KIBO:

Chief Minister Pema Khandu yesterday handed over KIBO, a powerful AI-driven reading device to students of Donyi Polo Mission School for the Hearing and Visually Impaired, Itanagar. In a social media post, Khandu emphasized that with KIBO, children can now access printed, handwritten, and digital content on their own, in their own language, and at their own pace. KIBO has been developed by the Department of Social Justice & Empowerment in collaboration with Trestle Labs aimed at providing an inclusive learning experience, allowing individuals to access and interact with content independently, similar to their sighted peers.

Manipur Governor, Ajay Kumar Bhalla has suggested university administration for arranging student exchange programs with other universities of the country and later on with foreign countries to strive for excellence and bring laurels to the State which elevates the university's stature and impact. Addressing the gathering during the 10th Foundation Day Celebration of Manipur University at Takyelpat in Imphal yesterday, the Governor said that the youth of the country need to lead in a rapidly changing world and think deeply, act responsively and lead courageously.

TRAINING:

The Tripura Women's Commission has launched a free sewing training program in Agartala to empower women and promote self-reliance. Aimed at making women economically independent, the program will train 120 women in its first phase in batches

of 15 over one month. As part of the initiative, Tripura Chief Minister, Dr. Manik Saha, will distribute free sewing machines to the trained women at a ceremony to be held at Muktadhara Manch in Agartala on the 18th of this month.

He also served as the Governor of Jammu and Kashmir, Bihar, and Goa. President Droupadi Murmu has expressed grief over the demise of the former governor and expressed her condolences to his family and followers. Prime Minister Narendra Modi also expressed grief over the demise and said that his thoughts are with his family and supporters in this hour of grief. Meghalaya Chief Minister, Conrad K Sangma also conveyed his condolences and described Malik a warm and gracious individual who was deeply enthusiastic to the development of Meghalaya.
