Prime Minister Narendra Modi will be on a two-day visit to Gujarat tomorrow. On the first day of his visit, Mr Modi is scheduled to inaugurate multiple development projects worth five thousand 400 crores rupees in Ahmedabad. On the second day of his visit, the Prime Minister will inaugurate localised production of hybrid battery electrodes and flag-off Battery electric vehicle exports to 100 countries at Hansalpur in Ahmedabad.

Union Home Minister Amit Shah inaugurated a two-day All India Speakers' Conference at the Delhi Assembly in the National Capital today. The conference marks the centenary of election of Vithalbhai Patel as India's first Speaker of the Central Legislative Assembly. Speaking on the occasion, the Home Minister emphasized that, just as the country's freedom was important, it is equally essential to ensure that the nation was run democratically after independence. He said that Vitthalbhai Patel laid the foundation for establishing democratic governance based on Indian ideas. On the occasion, the Home Minister released a commemorative stamp honouring Vitthalbhai Patel and inaugurated a special exhibition showcasing rare archival records, photographs, and documents on India's first elected speaker and the evolution of India's parliamentary institutions.

ISRO has successfully accomplished the first Integrated Air Drop Test for end-to-end demonstration of parachute-based deceleration system for Gaganyaan missions. It was a critical exercise to validate the parachute system that will bring back astronauts safely under the mission, from its spaceport in. This test is a joint effort of ISRO, Indian Air Force, DRDO, Indian Navy, and Indian Coast Guard. Additionally, ISRO is also preparing for upcoming tests such as the second Test Vehicle Demonstration mission and the first uncrewed Gaganyaan mission (G1), which will pave the way for India's maiden human spaceflight.

Minister for Education, PD Sona has expressed condolences on the tragic fire accident at the boys' hostel of Papikrong School in Shi Yomi District. In a social media post, Sona announced that the State Government will extend all necessary relief and assistance to the victims and their families. Meanwhile, Sona has instructed the District Administration and the School Administration to carry out a thorough investigation and to provide immediate support to the affected students and their families. As per reports, the accident occurred between 1:00 and 2:00 AM today morning due to a short circuit. The incident has resulted in the loss of one young student, while three others have sustained injuries. Additionally, the hostel has also been completely damaged in the fire.

Mentor Secretary, Y.V.V.J. Rajashekhar convened a review meeting at Namsai yesterday. The Mentor Secretary in his remarks, urged the administration and all HoDs to focus on four critical sectors i.e. Health, Education, NABARD initiatives, and Infrastructure development. In health sector, he discussed issues over the shortage of human resources in the district hospital and suggested measures to address the issue. Expressing concern over low performance in mathematics and languages, especially at the primary level, he directed the concerned HoD to collect data, identify gaps, and take corrective measures. The meeting was attended by local MLA Chau Zingnu Namchoom, In-charge Deputy Commissioner Nang Koliani Namchoom, Heads of Departments and district officials.

A Special Investigation Team led by SP Naharlagun, Dr Nyelam Nega, have solved the murder of a 16-year-old student within 24 hours. Based on the available lead, a Master's 3<sup>rd</sup> Semester student of Rajiv Gandhi University and resident of Dokum Colony have been arrested. Upon questioning, the accused confessed to the murder while under the influence of intoxicants. He further admitted that after committing the crime, he fled from the scene and disposed of the weapon of offence. Meanwhile, a case has been registered at Naharlagun Police Station.

The Met Centre Itanagar has issued a yellow alert for 13 districts of Arunachal Pradesh. MCI has predicted that thunderstorm with lightning, and heavy rain likely to occur at isolated places over the state.

The "Battle of Minds" 2.0 Aalo Zonal final was held at Aalo Multipurpose Hall yesterday. Minister RD & Panchayati Raj, Ojing Tasing attended as chief guest. The final round event was participated by Government Higher Secondary School Yomcha, Government Secondary School Pakam, PM Shri KV Aalo and RKM School, Aalo. RK

Indian Shooter Aishwary Pratap Singh Tomar has won gold medal in the 50-meter rifle three-position event at the 16<sup>th</sup> Asian Shooting Championship in Shymkent, Kazakhstan. He scored 462.5 points to finish on top. China's Wenyu Zhao won silver medal with 462 points, while Japan's Naoya Okada claimed bronze with 445.8 points. Earlier, Indian men's team of Aishwary Pratap Singh Tomar, Chain Singh and Akhil Sheoran bagged silver medal in the 50-metre rifle three positions team event.
