Prime Minister Narendra Modi expressed pride in dedicating the Kartavya Bhavan-3 to the nation and highlighted it as an example of state-of-the-art infrastructure. In a social media post, Modi wrote, Kartavya Bhavan is a symbol of government's commitment and continuous efforts toward serving every individual. He added it will not only help in swiftly delivering government's policies and schemes to the people but will also provide a new momentum to the nation's development. Kartavya Bhavan-3 is part of the broader transformation of the Central Vista. It is the first among several upcoming Common Central Secretariat buildings, aim to streamline administrative processes and enable agile governance.

A landmark study by the Indian Council of Medical Research in Jharkhand has been praised by the World Health Organization as a model for tuberculosis care. Published in The Lancet Global Health in 2023, the RATIONS study found that providing nutritional support to TB patients significantly improved treatment outcomes and reduced mortality. According to study, patients who received food rations showed better recovery and survival rates compared to those on standard care. Recognizing its impact, WHO has called on countries in the South-East Asia Region to adopt similar strategies to meet global End TB targets.
