Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chinese President Xi Jinping today reaffirmed that the two countries were development partners and not rivals, and that their differences should not turn into disputes. Both leaders met on the sidelines of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization Summit in Tianjin. Prime Minister Modi underlined the importance of peace and tranquillity on the border areas for the continued development of bilateral relations. They expressed commitment to a fair, reasonable, and mutually acceptable resolution of the boundary question proceeding from the political perspective of their overall bilateral relations and the long-term interests of the two peoples. Recognizing the important decisions taken by the two Special Representatives in their Talks earlier this month, both leaders have agreed to further support their efforts.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has said that the nation has to move forward on the path of Atmanirbhar Bharat and goal of a Developed India with the Mantra of Vocal for Local. Sharing his thought in the Mann Ki Baat programme on Akashvani today, Mr Modi said, during the festive season the countrymen should never forget about Swadeshi. The Prime Minister said, the spirit of Ek Bharat-Shreshtha Bharat, the unity of the country is very important for the development of the nation and sports play a big role in it. He mentioned about the first Khelo India Water Sports Festival which was held at Dal Lake in Srinagar where 800 athletes from all over the country participated.

Governor Lt. General K.T. Parnaik (Retd.) has extended his warm greetings to the people of the State on the auspicious occasion of Solung Festival. The Governor, in his message, said that Solung is the essence of the way of life for the Adi people.
