The Dimapur Municipal Council (DMC) has banned the sale and distribution of unlabelled 20-litre water containers and any consumable goods lacking proper packaging information. In a press release, the DMC stated that it has observed widespread sale of 20-litre packaged drinking water without company labels, violating Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) regulations and posing potential health risks. Here is a report:

Traders have been directed to immediately stop the sale and distribution of 20 litre unlabelled water containers and improperly packaged consumables. The Dimapur Municipal Council reminded that FSSAI guidelines mandate all packaged drinking water to carry clear and verifiable labelling. The DMC further warned that regular inspections will be conducted, and strict action will be taken against violators under the Food Safety and Standards Act.

Nagaland Lok Sabha MP S. Supongmeren Jamir yesterday joined hundreds of INDIA alliance leaders including Rahul Gandhi and Mallikarjun Kharge in a protest march to the Election Commission office, opposing the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls in Bihar. In a social media post, the Chief Minister called for renewed efforts to equip youth with knowledge, opportunities, and a voice to shape a future that respects heritage and supports the Sustainable Development Goals.



In a major step towards addressing the rising cases of Human–Elephant Conflict (HEC) in Wokha district, Advisor for Agriculture, Mhathung Yanthan, led a nine day constituency-wide awareness and mitigation programme concluding on August 10. The campaign promoted long-term, low-cost solutions for communities affected by crop loss, property damage, and human casualties due to elephant encounters. Renowned wildlife veterinarian Dr. Rudraditya from Bengaluru conducted live demonstrations on chilibased elephant deterrents, hands-on training for farmers, and community discussions. The nine-day programme covered 14 villages along Pyotchu–Lakhuti and Baghty–Sanis–Okotso routes.
