Governor-designate Ajay Kumar Bhalla, will be sworn in as the Governor of Nagaland today. The swearing-in ceremony will take place at Raj Bhavan at 10:30 AM. A report -

Following the demise of Governor La. Ganesan on August 15, President Droupadi Murmu appointed Manipur Governor Ajay Kumar Bhalla to discharge the functions of the Governor of Nagaland, in addition to his existing duties. Ajay Kumar Bhalla is a veteran Indian Administrative Service officer who retired after serving in several top positions within the Ministry of Home Affairs. He notably held the post of Union Home Secretary. Mr. Bhalla assumed office as the Governor of Manipur in 2024. His expertise in administration and security matters has earned him recognition as a capable leader)

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will be on a two-day visit to Gujarat beginning today. During the visit, Mr Modi will inaugurate and lay the foundation stone of development projects worth over 5,400 crore rupees at Khodaldham ground in Ahmedabad this evening. Prime Minister will also address a public function on the occasion. On the second day of his visit tomorrow, Mr Modi will inaugurate localised production of hybrid battery electrodes and flag-off Battery electric vehicle exports to 100 countries at Hansalpur in Ahmedabad.

In a bid to decongest city roads and streamline traffic movement, the Office of the Deputy Commissioner, Kohima, has announced a series of new traffic regulations with immediate effect. As part of the measures, the movement of commercial taxis has been restricted within key areas of Kohima town between 9:00 AM and 5:00 PM daily. We have a report-

According to the official order, commercial taxis will no longer be allowed to enter from Lower PWD Junction or exit through Middle Midland Junction near Oking Hospital between 9:00 AM and 5:00 PM daily. In a related move, the Deputy Commissioner's office has also declared a 'No Parking Zone' along the stretch from Fira Hotel to Assamese Church, located under Jail Colony, Ward-19. The decision was prompted by widespread unauthorized roadside parking, which has been causing severe obstruction to traffic flow. Deputy Commissioner

and Chairman of the Regional Transport Authority, Kohima, B. Henok Buchem, said the decision has been taken in the public interest and appealed to the citizens of Kohima to cooperate with the authorities to ensure the smooth implementation of the new rule. The DC also warned that vehicles parked in violation of this order will be towed at the owner's expense and penalized under Section 179 of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988.
