Prime Minister Narendra Modi's flagship initiative, Pariksha Pe Charcha has been conferred with the Guinness World Record for the 'Most people registered on a Citizen Engagement Platform in one month'. This recognition is a testament of achievement made with three crore 53 lakh registrations during the eight editions of the programme, hosted on the MyGov platform. Pariksha Pe Charcha is a unique platform conceptualised and led by Prime Minister Modi wherein he directly interacts with students, teachers, and parents. The official Guinness World Record certificate was formally presented at a ceremony held in New Delhi yesterday. The event was graced by the Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan, Electronics and Information Technology, Railways and Information and Broadcasting Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw and others.

India has emerged as the world's fifth biggest aviation market, handling 241 million passengers, while Mumbai-Delhi was one of the busiest airport pairs in 2024. This was stated by International Airport Transport Association (IATA), which has released the latest edition of the World Air Transport Statistics (WATS) for 2024. Here is a report-

V/C According to IATA, India saw 211 million air passengers last year, a growth of 11.1 per cent compared to 2023, ahead of Japan, which handled 205 million passengers with an annual rise of 18.6 per cent. The US remains the world's biggest aviation market with 876 million passengers in 2024 on the strength of its domestic market, growing 5.2 per cent year-on-year. China was the second-biggest passenger market, with 741 million passengers, a growth of 18.7 per cent compared to 2023. While UK was at the 3rd spot with 261 million passengers, Spain stood at the 4th position with 241 million. The figures include all international and domestic passengers departing or arriving in each country.

The Nagaland Foothills Road Coordination Committee has emphasised the need for inclusive representation and a corruption-free approach to the ongoing Foothills Road project. In an emergency meeting held yesterday, the Committee adopted several resolutions. However, it expressed concern over the exclusion of key tribal bodies and legislators, calling it an oversight that undermines collective representation. It also reaffirmed its firm stand against any form of illegal taxation or demands by non-state actors on contractors or departments working on the project.
