The Government has said that the retail prices of tomatoes have spiked across the country due to temporary localised factors rather than any fundamental demand-supply imbalance or production shortfall. Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution Ministry said that in Delhi, the tomato prices soared to 73 rupees per kilogram due to heavy rainfall in the northern and north-western regions of the country since the last week of July. It added that this weather-related disruption caused prices to spike to as high as 85 rupees per kg by the end of July. At present, the all-India average retail price of tomato is 52 rupees per kg, which is still lower than 54 rupees per kg last year.
