INAUGURATION:

Union Home Minister, Amit Shah inaugurated the newly constructed Brahmaputra wing of the Raj Bhavan in Guwahati yesterday followed by E-inauguration of National Cyber Forensic Laboratory at Golaghat and foundation stone laying cum inauguration of various development projects for the Armed Forces. Union Home Minister Amit Shah has said that the Central government is prioritizing a forensic evidence-based approach in the criminal justice system in the country. E-Inaugurating the National Cyber Forensic Laboratory, the Home Minister said that Cyber Security and forensic science are very important for the citizens as it will protect the hard earned income of citizens as well as the country as a whole. Addressing a large gathering, Mr. Shah said that under the leadership of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, the Union government brought three new laws by abolishing the British era Indian Penal Code to provide justice to the citizens and to make the criminal justice system people-centric and scientific.

FREEDOM FIGHTER:

Union Home Minister Amit Shah yesterday hailed Golap Borbora as a visionary socialist leader, freedom fighter and Chief Minister of Assam, while launching his year-long birth centenary celebrations in Guwahati. Describing Borbora as Assam's first non-Congress Chief Minister who worked for the welfare of the masses, Mr. Shah lauded his brief yet impactful tenure that saw the establishment of several key institutions. A book on Borbora's life was also unveiled at the event. He also laid foundation stones for multiple Armed Forces development projects and addressed a Panchayat Sanmilan attended by around 20,000 representatives from the BJP and other NDA allies.

MISSION:

Manipur Governor Ajay Kumar Bhalla reviewed the overall functioning of the Manipur State Livelihood Mission (MSRLM) at Raj Bhavan in Imphal yesterday. During the meeting, the Director of MSRLM and other senior officers made detailed presentations of ongoing projects aimed at uplifting rural communities. The review covered progress made under various initiatives, financial aspects, manpower requirements and other key agendas. Special emphasis was laid on the performance of Self Help Groups, activities of Rural Self Employment Training Institutes and training programs conducted for Internally Displaced Persons. The Governor directed the officers to further strengthen manpower and enhance the outreach of existing projects and schemes to ensure greater impact at the grassroot level.

MASTER PLAN:

Tripura Chief Minister Dr. Manik Saha has announced that nearly 70 percent work of preparing the Master Plan for Agartala city has already been completed. The state government is working towards bringing a transformative change in urban development. Speaking after inaugurating the Vivekananda Township Housing Project at Kaman Chowmuhani in Agartala yesterday and handing over keys to the new residents, the Chief Minister said that around ₹1,500 crore will be invested over the next five years under two major schemes − Satellite Town Development and Mukhyamantri Nagar Unnayan. In the first phase, development works worth ₹530 crore are being taken up with financial support from the Asian Development Bank. Dr. Saha further informed that a proposal has been placed to draw water from Bangladesh's Titas river for supplying drinking water to all 51 wards under the Agartala Municipal Corporation.

TEACHERS:

For the first time in any academic year, the total number of teachers in the country has crossed the one crore mark in the academic year 2024-25. This was revealed in a report by Ministry of Education on Unified District Information System for Education Plus on school education in India. According to the report, this is a rise of 6.7 percent compared to 2022-23 in the same period. Meanwhile, India currently has almost 15 lakh schools with over 24 crore students. Amongst these, almost 50 percent students are enrolled in government schools, followed by 41 percent in private schools and the rest in government aided schools. Furthermore, female representation has also increased with over 54.3 percent school teachers being female and girls' enrolment currently at 48.3 percent.

ROAD:

In Meghalaya, the Divisional Officer of Pynursla Civil Sub-Division in partial modification of of previous public notice on the 19th of this month, has informed that the stretch from Laitlyngkot to Lyngkyrdem would remain closed from 11:30 a.m. 4:00 p.m. during day time and night time from 9:00 p.m. to 4.00 a.m. The closure arrangement will be temporary and on a daily basis the 1st September to the 15th of September. All traffic will be permitted to cross from both ends i.e. Lyngkyrdem and Laitlyngkot latest by 11:30 a.m after which from 12:00 Noon onwards, construction works will be started by the concerned company along the stretch. All commuters and members of the public are further strongly advised to exercise extreme caution while commuting through this stretch and to kindly avoid taking non-essential travel during or immediately after heavy rainfall and also during night-time hours. Emergency health services will be facilitated during the closure periods and they may contact the Pynursla Police Station.

DAY-SIKKIM:

Sikkim joined the Nation in celebrating the National Sports Day to pay tribute to the Hockey Legend Major Dhyan Chand on his Birth Anniversary yesterday. The Sikkim Government organised the state-level celebration of the National Sports Day 2025 on the 30th to 31st of this month with a series of sporting activities.
