NEWS IN ORDER:-

CABINET

The union cabinet on Friday took certain key decisions including the approval of the four new components under the existing central sector scheme of special development packages for Tripura and assam with a total outlay of four thousand 250 crore rupees. Briefing media in new Delhi about the cabinet decisions, Information and Broadcasting Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw added that the development of Infrastructure and livelihood projects will create employment opportunities resulting in income generation in these states. The union cabinet further approved the continuation of targeted subsidies for Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana consumers. The scheme which is specifically targeted towards the North Eastern States of Assam and Tripura is targeted to promote equity by improving the socioeconomic condition of vulnerable and marginalised groups of people. The approval will also boost employment opportunities, provide health services, promote education and skilling and income through livelihood activities for youth and women.

MINISTER

Union Minister of State for Petroleum and Natural Gas and Tourism, Suresh Gopi visited Bishnupur district of Manipur on Friday and chaired a meeting to review the overall functioning of various line departments. He also assessed the implementation of key government schemes during his visit to Manipur. In the meeting, the meeting, Deputy Commissioner presented a comprehensive presentation on the district's tourism potential and the Model Digital Island which has been developed by the District Administration. The Union Minister of State emphasized the importance of further development of Loktak Lake into a world class destination. He also provided constructive feedback to the projects taken up by various departments in the districts and spoke about the Prime Minister's dream of a transformed Northeastern region. Later, Suresh Gopi also visited District Hospital, Bishnupur and conducted a thorough inspection of the facility.

ARUNACHAL

The State Cabinet in Arunachal Pradesh have approved multiple policy measures aimed at youth development, social welfare, education, and administrative reform. The Cabinet approved the Arunachal Pradesh State Youth Policy 2025, which outlines nine Youth Development Goals. The policy adopts an action-oriented and collaborative approach involving government departments, non-governmental organizations, community-based organizations, and youth organizations. Under the Chief Minister Social Security Scheme, the Cabinet also approved changes to the Chief Minister Disability Pension component. The minimum age restriction has been removed, and the disability eligibility threshold has been revised from 70% to 40%. To enhance the higher education sector, the Cabinet also approved the creation of new posts in the education department for strengthening higher education infrastructure across the state.

PROSECUTION

The Meghalaya government is counting on the newly-constituted Directorate of Prosecution to address the concerns of low conviction in cases of crime against women in the state. Chief Secretary DP Wahlang, who held a detailed meeting with the chairperson of the National Commission for Women (NCW) Vijaya K Rahatkar, in Shillong on Friday, said that conviction depends on the strength of the prosecution and Government has taken swift action by separating prosecution from investigation. The Chief Secretary also maintained that there is no sudden spike in crime against women in Meghalaya. Earlier, the National Commission for Women expressed concern over the growing trend of a large number of single mothers, women living with HIV, and those struggling with drug abuse or addiction in Meghalaya . NCW Chairperson, Vijaya K Rahatkar said that the Chief Secretary as well as the Meghalaya DGP has assured of taking to address the challenges which has been plaguing concrete measures Meghalaya for some time now.

HERITAGE

Minister of Tourism and Higher Education in Nagaland, Temjen Imna Along has emphasised the importance of preserving indigenous heritage while adapting to the demands of a rapidly advancing technological world. Speaking at the 'Development of Education in North Eastern India Exhibition' organised by the National Archives of India and Department of Higher Education in Kohima on Friday, Along expressed deep gratitude to the Ministry of Culture and the National Archives for their sustained commitment to promoting and documenting the diverse histories of the country. Highlighting the unique knowledge systems traditionally practiced by the Nagas, such as the Morung-based education, the Minister called on the need to document the discipline and strong values of the forefathers. RAKSHABANDHAN

EXCISE

The Excise Department in Nagaland has reported significant seizures and enforcement actions over the past year. Presenting an overview of department's activities during the meeting of the Kohima District Planning & Development Board, Deputy Commissioner of Excise (Zonal), Venezolu Dawhuo, informed that 1,040 cases were registered under the Nagaland Liquor Total Prohibition Act in the last financial year. The department seized over 1.7 kilograms of heroin and 9,000 bottles of codeine-based cough syrup, including a major haul of 1.6 kilograms of heroin at Khuzama Check Gate last September. Between January 2024 and June this year, fines exceeding 11 lakh rupees were collected.

FOOTBALL

The North East United FC defeated local favourite Shillong Lajong FC in the Group E fixture of Durand Cup here at JN Stadium in Shillong on Friday evening. Riding on the two goals of its forward Alaeddine Ajaraie ,North East United FC defeated Shillong Lajong by a slight margin of 2-1 at the final whistle. Shillong Lajong entered the field with the aim of conquering the fortress of NE United FC but received the first blow at the 5th Minute in the first half when NE United forward Alaeddine Ajaraie struck the goal on the pass by Chema. The first half ended with 1-0 lead for NE United FC. In the second half, Shillong Lajong made vehement efforts to equal the score

and succeeded in the 81st Minute when Figo scored the goal on a pinpoint pass by Tariang. However, NE United FC immediately took the lead with the second goal by Alaeddine Ajaraie.

TIRANGA

The 72nd Battalion of Sashastra Seema Bal (SSB), Yuksam in Gyalshing district of Sikkim on Friday organised a Tiranga Yatra as part of the Har Ghar Tiranga programme. The event aimed to promote patriotism among the local population. The Tiranga Yatra was attended by personnel of the 72nd Bn SSB, Yuksam, and local residents. The procession showcased the national flag and highlighted the significance of the Har Ghar Tirenga program. The event was organised to encourage citizens to participate in the Har Ghar Tiranga program and hoist the national flag in their homes, fostering a sense of national unity and pride.

RABINDRANATH

The 84th death anniversary of Rabindranath Tagore was observed in Agartala on Friday under the initiative of the Information and Culture Department of the Tripura government. Chief Minister, Dr. Manik Saha, was present as the chief guest at the inaugural session of the event. Speaking on the occasion, Chief Minister said that Rabindranath Tagore is being followed as an ideal by everyone even as he added that people look for solution form his literature in times of crisis. Informing that the Bard of Bengal visited Tripura seven times and wrote three novels, Chief Minister said that the patriotism of Rabindranath Tagore is an inspiration for the next generation. The Chief Minister also asked the youths to imbibe his footsteps and change the world. A host of colourful programmes were also presented on the occasion.

WEATHER

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has predicted heavy rainfall across Arunachal Pradesh over the next couple of days. For today, an Orange Alert has been issued in five districts. The districts are Papum Pare Lower Subansiri, Lohit Anjaw and Changlang, and the remaining districts are under a Yellow Alert. IMD has predicted heavy to very heavy rainfall from 7 to 20 cm at isolated places in these districts. The weather office has warned of possible landslides, flash floods, and traffic disruptions, and advised residents to follow safety precautions and official updates.
