NEWS IN DETAIL:-

CJI-GAUHATI

Chief Justice of India B.R. Gavai said that the judiciary, executive, and legislature exist to deliver justice to the last citizen of the country. The Chief Justice was speaking after inaugurating the newly constructed Court Building of the Gauhati High Court's Itanagar Permanent Bench at Naharlagun in Arunachal Pradesh yesterday in the presence of Union Minister Kiren Rijiju and Arjun Ram Meghwal, Chief Minister Pema Khandu, Deputy Chief Minister, Chowna Mein along with a host of dignitaries. Stressing the need for a calibrated and coordinated effort among these pillars, he said every step must be taken to ensure that justice is delivered at the earliest and at the least cost. The Chief Justice of India also added that North-East is one of the most important parts of India, and the Constitution provides special provisions to preserve and safeguard the tribal communities of the region.

SIKKIM-ADALAT

Sikkim Chief Minister, Prem Singh Tamang yesterday launched the Nari Adalat on the occasion of first Amma Samman Diwas at Rongpo. Nari Adalat is a community-based forum run by women to provide accessible and informal justice, especially in rural and semi-urban areas of Sikkim. The idea behind Nari Adalat is to empower women to address disputes and social issues that directly affect them, without having to depend entirely on the formal court system. Unlike regular courts, which involve formal legal procedures, official judges, and lengthy processes, Nari Adalat works in a flexible and dialogue-based manner.

TIRANGA

In Manipur, the momentum of Har Ghar Tiranga has gained day by day and different activities under the campaign have been going on across the State. The Jiribam District Administration in collaboration with the District Child Protection Unit organised a Tiranga Rangoli Making Competition yesterday as part of the Har Ghar Tiranga Campaign. It was at Gulamchat Open Shelter Home in Patchao, Jiribam. During the competition, four teams displayed well decorated Rangolis showcasing talent and creativity of the children. Tiranga Rakhi Making Competition was also held in Noney district. Meanwhile, in Tripura, Chief Minister Dr. Manik Saha visited the Shibnagar area in Agartala yesterday and distributed national flag to the residents of the locality as part of the nationwide campaign 'Har Ghar Tiranga'. The Chief Minister emphasized the significance of the initiative and urged the citizens to actively participate in the campaign and take pride in the nation's heritage and unity.

ARREST

In Manipur, security forces have arrested five cadres of different proscribed outfits during the search operations conducted since last Saturday. The Manipur Police report said that a cadre of UNLF (P) was arrested from his residence in Bishnupur district and recovered one .303 rifle with magazine, five magazines of different rifles, one hand grenade, 501 number of live ammunition and items. Further the report said that two cadres of KCP (City Meitei) and one cadre each of KCP (Ibungo Ngangom Group) and KCP (PWG) were arrested yesterday from different places of Imphal East and Imphal West districts. They were involved in extortion from the general public.

HOUSE

The Mizoram government is making all efforts to set up a guest house in Navi Mumbai. A statement issued yesterday stated that Chief Secretary, Khilli Ram Meena met his Maharashtra counterpart Rajesh Kumar Meena in

Mumbai to discuss the proposed Mizoram House in Navi Mumbai. The Chief Secretary of Maharashtra has directed the officers concerned to ensure permission to the application submitted by the Mizoram government in this regard.

VISIT

In Assam, Minister for Public Health and Engineering, Jayanta Mallah Baruah yesterday visited Kokradanga bordering Indo-Bangladesh in South Salmara Mankachar district. During his visit, the Minister took stock of the erosion-affected areas along the Brahmaputra river. The Minister also visited two sites of Jal Jeevan Mission in the district.

HEALTH CAMP

In Nagaland, the Assam Rifles conducted a Health and Wellness Camp for women in Kiphire District with an aim of providing accessible healthcare services, preventive guidance, and wellness awareness to women of all age groups. Medical teams from the Assam Rifles offered free health check-ups, consultations on women's health, nutrition, hygiene, and preventive care, and distributed essential medicines. Special emphasis was placed on the early detection of health issues, maternal health, and lifestyle-related counselling. The camp witnessed enthusiastic participation from women across all age groups, who availed the services with gratitude. CAU

Vice Chancellor of Central Agricultural University (Imphal), Dr. Anupam Mishra, inaugurated an Agro-Eco Tourism Park and launched a one-year Paravet Certificate Course at the College of Veterinary Sciences & Animal Husbandry, Jalukie in Nagaland, on the occasion of the College's 9th Foundation Day. The 21-year-old from Assam pursued her BA in Sanskrit and Hindi at the university's Balliol College under the Department of Asian and Middle Eastern Studies.

IMD

The India Meteorological Department has forecast heavy to very heavy rainfall conditions over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal, Assam, Sikkim, Bihar, Meghalaya, and Arunachal Pradesh during the next 6 to 7 days. These conditions will continue over Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry, Karaikal, Telangana, besides Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram and Tripura.

PROJECT

The Union Power Ministry has listed six major hydropower projects in North East India as “vulnerable,” including the under-construction 2,000 MW Lower Subansiri project on the Assam- Arunachal Pradesh border. The Central Electricity Authority categorised these projects as vulnerable based on their location above 1,500 metres and position as the first in the river basin in the upper Himalayan reaches — conditions that heighten risks from flash floods, landslides, and other climate-induced hazards. The information was provided by Minister of State for Power, Shripad Naik, in Parliament.

DURAND

In Manipur, Real Kashmir FC gained a comfortable 3-1 victory over home side NEROCA FC in the Group F clash of the 134th IndianOil Durand Cup 2025 at Khuman Lampak Main Stadium in Imphal yesterday. The winning team finished their campaign with six points from three matches while NEROCA FC finished with two points. The final group stage match between the Indian Navy FT and TRAU FC will be played tomorrow to determine who will qualify for the knockouts as group winners. Meanwhile, in Meghalaya, NorthEast United FC will face Rangdajied United FC in their final Group-E fixture at the Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium in Shillong today. Already through to the quarterfinals of the 134th Indian Oil Durand Cup, NorthEast United FC will aim to wrap up the group stage with a flawless record. The Highlanders booked their place in the knockouts with a gritty 2-1 win over Shillong Lajong FC in the Northeast Derby. Both sides are tied on six points from two games, but NorthEast United progressed on a head-to-head advantage.
