The RMSA – 2016 Teachers will launch an indefinite sit-in-protest from today at the Directorate of School Education, Kohima to seek accountability, justice and fair redressal of their grievances. In a statement, RMSA stated the peaceful demonstration will continue without interruption until demands are addressed by the concerned authorities. The RMSA called upon civil societies and general public to stand in solidarity in asserting their constitutional right to peaceful protest. Their demands include recognition of salary and service benefits from their original date of appointment in 2016, implementation of the ROP 2017 pay scale, including annual increments, at par with SSA–RMSA 2010–13 teachers and enforcement of Office Memorandum issued on 29th March 2017.

Dimapur District Administration has revised the guidelines for the issuance and regulation of the Inner Line Permit (ILP), effective August 7, covering Dimapur, Chümoukedima, and Niuland. The new ILP framework categorizes applicants into groups such as floating population, labourers, transporters, private employees, teachers, students, traders, and tourists.

## ILP V/C:

Key highlights of the guidelines include floating population such as shoppers, patients will receive free 30-day permits, daily labourers and vendors will pay 50 rupees for one month or 100 rupees for six months. Transporters to pay 50 to 100 rupees depending on route length. Construction workers to get 165-day permits at 300 rupees with employer sponsorship capped at 100 workers, Private employees will pay 1,000 rupees annually; teachers and clergy get 3-year permits at 1500. Students are fee-exempt; non-teaching staff/domestic workers pay 1,000 per year, Traders and business partners have options ranging from 90-day to 3-year permits. Tourists: Domestic will be 200 for 30 days while Foreign will be charged 500 rupees, subject to visa/PAP. Landlords must report non-indigenous tenants to authorities. Hotels and guesthouses must notify police of out-of-state guests. Only authorised agencies may check ILPs; civilian-imposed penalties are also punishable.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi is expected to arrive in Manipur on 13th of this month for a few hours and hold public meetings at two places. A meeting was held at Raj Bhawan in Imphal to discuss the visit of the Prime Minister to the State. The meeting was chaired by the Governor of Manipur Ajay Kumar Bhalla and attended by former Chief Minister N. Biren, Speaker of Manipur Legislative Assembly- Th. Satyabrata, MLAs and the President of BJP Manipur Pradesh-Adhikarimayum Sarda Devi.

Skywatchers across the world witnessed a stunning event on last night, a total lunar eclipse, also known as 'Chandra Grahan'. This lunar eclipse, which is the second one for this year, also produced a Blood Moon. The Earth's shadow started covering the lunar disc at 9:57 PM and The total lunar eclipse peaked around 11.48 pm and ended at around 12:22 am. The lunar eclipse lasted for a little over 48 minutes across India for celestial enthusiasts to witness. The eclipse was visible to the naked eye.
