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Nagaland's School Education Advisor Kekhrielhoulie Yhome yesterday appealed to RMSA-2016 teachers to return to their classrooms as their agitation demanding regularisation of services entered the 10th day. Addressing a press conference in Kohima, Mr Yhome expressed concern over government school children being left without teachers and urged the educators to await the court's verdict, as the matter is currently sub-judice.

He emphasized that the government is not opposed to the court's eventual decision and has formed a committee, headed by the Principal Secretary, to study the issue in detail and recommending a solution.

The Advisor noted that the 367 agitating teachers were appointed under a centrally sponsored scheme on contractual terms, which included termination clauses and no entitlement to scale pay. Among 5,058 such teachers in the state, only a section of the RMSA-2016 batch has taken legal recourse. While lauding the Naga Students' Federation's willingness to mediate, he urged that legal and administrative processes be allowed to proceed. Mr Yhome, along with senior officials, also visited the protest site and requested the teachers to join the proposed committee and call off their agitation. Meanwhile, RMSA-2016 batch spokesperson Renbemo L Patton said, that the teachers have unanimously conveyed to the advisor that they would not accept any proposal unless a workable solution is formulated. He said the teachers would intensify their agitation from Monday.

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The government has cut down the tax on auto components used in the manufacturing of the majority of Motor cars and Motor bikes to 18 percent from 28 percent GST slab. Under the new tax structure, the GST rates on Buses with sitting capacity of upto 10 persons have been slashed to 18 percent from the previously taxed 28 percent. This move is set to make ticket prices affordable and encourage people to shift towards public transport, reducing congestion and pollution. Similarly, the GST on tractors upto 1800cc has also been reduced to 5 percent marking a significant step leading to push demand in both domestic and export segments.
