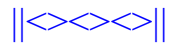


Morning News Script

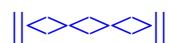

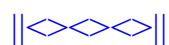
Under the next generation GST reforms, the government announced a major reduction in the tax on sports goods, slashing the tax rate from 12 percent to 5 percent. This move is intended to make sports equipment more affordable, boost domestic manufacturing, and encourage greater participation in sports across the country. The decision is expected to benefit consumers directly while also promoting fitness and a healthier lifestyle. Under GST 2.0, tax rate on bicycles has also been reduced from 12 percent to 5 percent.
