The State Election Commission of Nagaland has announced the conduct of a fresh election to Ward 11 (Zhipa) of the Pfutsero Town Council under Phek District. According to the official notification, polling for the unreserved Ward 11 will be held on 28th October, with voting scheduled between 7:30 AM and 4:00 PM. The filing of nomination papers will take place from 6th to 9th October, while the last date for withdrawal of candidature is 18th October. Counting of votes and declaration of results will be held on 31st October. With the announcement of the election schedule on 26th September, the Model Code of Conduct (MCC) has come into immediate effect within the jurisdiction of the Pfutsero Town Council, including the ward going to polls, and will remain in force until the completion of the election process. Additionally, the Commission has appointed T.L. Kiusumong Tikhir and A. Zibenthung Kikon, both Joint Secretaries in the state government, as Election Observers for the upcoming election to the said ward.

A Jail Visit Committee constituted by the State Government following WP(C) Suo Moto No. 8/2018 conducted an inspection of Central Jail Dimapur. The Committee comprised Member Secretary of NSLSA, Neiko Akami, Director General of Prisons, K. Hamtok Phom, and Superintendent of the Jail, Mr. Solezhol Neikha. During the visit, the Committee noted that the jail currently houses 190 inmates. The committee recommended the need for a well-planned and functional drainage system suitable for all seasons within the jail premises. Following the inspection, the Member Secretary of NSLSA, accompanied by the Principal District & Sessions Judge-cum-Chairman of DLSA Dimapur and panel lawyers, reviewed the status of legal aid provided to convicted inmates by NSLSA at the High Court level. Legal aid was further extended to four more convicted persons to assist them in filing appeals before the High Court. During interactions with the inmates, six convicts expressed their inability to afford private legal representation due to financial constraints and requested legal aid.

The country also made notable strides in developing indigenous deep-sea technologies, including vehicles and pressure-resistant materials, with successful trials already in progress. By venturing into the depths of the ocean, India is not only unlocking vast reserves of minerals, biodiversity, and energy, but also positioning itself among the few nations with advanced deep-sea exploration technology.



The government has made significant tax reduction in the healthcare sector to ease the financial burden on the common man. Under GST 2.0, the government has waived off taxes on 36 life saving drugs used for the treatment of cancer and severe chronic diseases.
