The election of the post of Vice President will be held today. NDA nominee and Maharashtra Governor C P Radhakrishnan will face INDIA bloc's nominee and former Supreme Court Judge B Sudershan Reddy in this election. A report-

VP BYTE- The Vice President is elected by an electoral college consisting of members of both Houses of Parliament. The voting in this election is held by a secret ballot. Presently, the Lok Sabha has 542 Members and the Rajya Sabha has 239 Members. The electorate for the Vice Presidential election this time is 781 and the majority mark at 391. The voting will begin at 10 AM and will continue till 5 PM. Counting of votes will be held after 6 PM onwards. For the first time, the Election of the Vice President will be held at the New Parliament Building.

The election is necessitated due to the resignation of Jagdeep Dhankhar in July this year.

Organized by Assam Rifles and Spear Corps, the event which concludes tomorrow, brings together leaders from various sectors to foster collaboration and a shared vision for Nagaland's progress.



Prime Minister Narendra Modi announced the next generation of GST reforms from the ramparts of Red Fort on this Independence Day. The Prime Minister's vision of creating a more efficient and citizen friendly economy was realised as the GST Council on the 3rd of September simplified the indirect tax system into a two-tier structure of 5 per cent and 18 per cent from a four-tier structure of 5 per cent, 12 per cent,18 per cent and 28 per cent. The GST reforms have been carried out with a focus on the common man and will come into effect from 22nd of this month. Our correspondent today takes a look at the GST reforms carried out in the sports sector.

GST S/B: The GST rate on sports goods has been reduced from 12 percent to 5 percent, making items like gloves, sports kits, equipment for general physical exercise and fishing gear cheaper. The Council has also announced GST cuts on toys, including tricycles, scooters, pedal cars and board games like chess, carrom and ludo to 5 percent from the previous 12 percent. This reduction is expected to make sports equipment more affordable for families and students, while also lowering costs for institutions that promote sports. The new tax reforms will give a strong push to India's sporting ecosystem, ensuring affordable access to equipment and encouraging greater participation across all age groups.)



The Directorate of Treasury & Accounts has directed all Drawing and Disbursing Officers (DDOs) to update pending e-NPS contributions on the Nodal Treasury portal by September 15. An Action Taken Report must be submitted by September 30. The DDOs have also been advised to regularly download and securely store archived data from the e-NPS portal for audit and backup

purposes. Any issues faced during the update process should be reported to the Directorate immediately.



In Football, India defeated Oman to finish third in the CAFA Nations Cup 2025 at Hisor Central Stadium in Tajikistan to win the bronze medal. The match finished 1-1 in regulation time after Udanta Singh scored the equaliser for India. Oman missed their first two chances in the penalty shoot-out and Gurpreet Singh Sandhu saved the final penalty as India won 3-2. This was the first time ever that India defeated Oman in an international football match and this was also a historic finish to their campaign.
