NDA candidate and Maharashtra Governor C P Radhakrishnan will be the new Vice-President of India. He defeated INDIA bloc candidate and former Supreme Court Judge B Sudershan Reddy by a margin of 152 votes. Briefing reporters after the counting of Votes for the Vice Presidential election, Rajya Sabha Secretary General and returning officer, P C Modi said, out of the total 781 electors, 767 MPs voted in the election. Mr Modi informed that out of 767 votes, 752 were found valid and 15 were declared invalid. He informed that out of 752 valid votes, Mr Radhakrishnan secured 452 votes while Sudershan Reddy got 300 votes in the 17th Vice-Presidential election held in New Parliament building yesterday.

The Rajya Sabha Secretary General informed that the election for the post of Vice President was held in a free, fair and orderly manner.

(V/C)- The Government has announced a big relief for the housing and construction sector by reducing GST rates on key building materials. Cement, which earlier attracted 28 percent GST, will now be taxed at 18 percent. The rates on items like marble, granite blocks and sand-lime bricks have been brought down from 12 percent to just 5 percent. Similarly, bamboo flooring, wooden joinery, packing cases and pallets will also now carry only 5 percent GST instead of 12 percent. This move is expected to make construction materials cheaper, reducing the overall cost of homes and infrastructure projects.
