India reaffirmed its commitment to an open, fair, and inclusive multilateral trading system with the World Trade Organization (WTO). At the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) Trade Ministers' Meeting held in Vladivostok yesterday, India also stressed the scope to leverage the SCO's collective strengths for shared prosperity. In a statement, Commerce & Industry Ministry said, the country highlighted the need for export diversification, reducing dependency, and building resilient supply chains. India also emphasised the importance of coordinated action to enhance trade flows, address vulnerabilities, and support inclusive growth across the region. Representing the Commerce and Industry Minister, Additional Secretary Amitabh Kumar highlighted the importance of developmentagenda that includes permanent solution centred on Public Stockholding for food security purposes, effective Special and Differential Treatment for developing countries, and restoration of a WTO fully functional two-tier dispute settlement system.

Chief of Air Staff, Air Chief Marshal Amar Preet Singh, has stated that Operation Sindoor demonstrated India's ability to strike swiftly, decisively, and with precision. Addressing the Passing Out Parade at the Officers Training Academy (OTA) in Chennai, he urged the newly commissioned officers to uphold the spirit of jointness in their service to the nation. The parade marked the commissioning of 130 male and 25 female officer cadets into the Indian Army. At the OTA, 21 foreign cadets, including nine men and 12 women from nine friendly nations, completed their training. Air Chief Marshal Singh spoke about the evolving nature of modern warfare and the need for integrated responses. He stated that the lessons from Operation Sindoor proved the successful synergy between the Army, Navy, Air Force, and other national security agencies.



Youth Affairs and Sports Minister Mansukh Mandaviya today said that Sundays on Cycle has become a movement in the country. He said, to stay fit and promote Swadeshi, over 50 MPs participated in the event, spreading the message of Swadeshi to the nation. The Minister said this while participating in Fit India: Sundays on Cycle with the theme of Garv se Swadeshi in collaboration with Indian Railways in New Delhi. He said that the event was organised at more than eight thousand locations across the country. Mr. Mandaviya added that Cycling is the message of Fit India; it is the best exercise, and it is the solution to pollution. Talking about GST Reforms, the minister highlighted that the GST on bicycles has been reduced from 18 per cent to 5 per cent.



A rare celestial event is set to unfold tonight as a total lunar eclipse will be visible in the night sky. The eclipse will be clearly visible across India, including cities like Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata, and Bengaluru, as well as in Asia, Australia, eastern Africa, and parts of Europe. According to media reports, the eclipse will begin tonight at 8:58 PM and end at 2:25 AM on September 8. This eclipse will be one of the longest in a decade, with 82 minutes of totality, and the entire event

will last over five hours. A lunar eclipse happens when the Earth comes between the Sun and the Moon, casting a shadow on the Moon. This can only occur during a full moon, when all three celestial bodies are perfectly aligned. The red glow comes from sunlight bending through Earth's atmosphere.



Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision of creating a more efficient and citizen friendly economy was realised as the GST Council on 3rd of September approved rates rationalisation with a focus on common man. The Council has simplified the indirect tax system into a two-tier structure of 5 per cent and 18 per cent from a four-tier structure of 5 per cent, 12 per cent, 18 per cent and 28 per cent. These reforms have reduced tax rates in many sectors easing the life of citizens. The GST reforms have been carried out with a focus on the common man and will come into effect from 22nd of this month. Let us have a look at the reforms undertaken for medical devices and equipments.

(GST BYTE: The GST Council in its meeting on Wednesday announced a series of tax reforms with multi-sectoral and multi-thematic focus aimed at easing tax burden and improving business conditions. The Council has announced a tax rate of 5 percent from the earlier 18 percent on all medical devices, and instruments for medical, surgical, dental and veterinary needs, other than the ones that are exempted specifically. Additionally, tax rate on bandages, diagnostic kits, glucometers, and other essential medical supplies has been slashed from 12 percent to 5 percent. GST has been reduced from 12 percent to nil on 33 life-saving drugs and from 5 percent to nil on 3 critical drugs used to treat cancer, rare diseases and severe chronic conditions.
