ASSAM

Prime Minister, Narendra Modi on Saturday said that Assamese Singer and songwriter, Bhupen Hazarika was one of the most extraordinary forces in India who worked for unity and national integration. Attending the birth centenary celebrations of music maestro and recipient Bharat Ratna Dr. Bhupen Hazarika in Guwahati, the Prime Minister said that Hazarika's work transcended linguistic and regional boundaries to unite people across the country and his song gave us new direction to the people. PM Modi also launched the Rs 100 commemorative coin and release a biography on the legendary singer in 21 languages on the occasion. Today, PM Modi will inaugurate and lay foundation stones of several development projects worth

Rs. 1800 crore in Assam. The PM will travel to Mangaldoi in Darrang district, where he will lay the foundation stone for the Darrang Medical College, Nursing College, and GNM School. He will also initiate construction of a new bridge over the Brahmaputra River, connecting Guwahati's Narengi and Darrang's Kuruwa and the Guwahati Ring Road project

MANIPUR

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has asserted that the Central Government has been continuously working to ensure peace and stability in Manipur. PM Modi during his visit to Manipur also met Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) taking shelter at different relief camps in valley districts at Imphal. He also inaugurated multiple projects including New Civil Secretariat, New Police Headquarters, Manipur Bhawans, IT-SEZ Building, Women Markets, Road Projects, Hostel, Eklavya Model Residential School and other infrastructure development projects worth rupees one thousand two hundred crore. Addressing a public gathering after the inauguration of multiple development projects in historic Kangla Fort of Imphal, the Prime Minister said that the interests of the people must be safeguard and that those forced to live in relief camps should be able to return to normal life. He said that seven thousand new houses have been approved for displaced families who were affected in the violence in the state. The Prime Minister said that any form of violence in Manipur is unfortunate and such violence is a grave injustice to both our ancestors and future generations.

AIZAWL

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday inaugurated Rs. 8,070 crore Bairabi-Sairang broad gauge railway line, which will link the landlocked Mizoram with the rest of the country by rail. Prime Minister Narendra Modi landed at Lengpui Airport. However, due to adverse weather conditions, he could not proceed to land at Țhuampui Helipad as a result, the inauguration of the Bairabi–Sairang railway line was conducted via video conference from the Lengpui airport. Prime Minister also flagged off the first Rajdhani express train between Aizawl and Delhi, two others trains- Aizawl-Guwahati and Aizawl-Kolkata, apart from inaugurating the new railway line. Prime Minister Narendra Modi, in his speech marking emphasized Mizoram's growing importance in India's development journey.

LAPANG

The Meghalaya government has declared three days of mourning as a mark of respect for former chief minister DD Lapang, who breathed his last on Friday. All official celebrations and major programmes have been cancelled for three days. A state funeral will be held at 1 pm on Monday, preceded by prayers at Lapang's residence at Lower Lachaumiere at 10 am. The NPP headquarters in Shillong was engulfed by grief on Saturday evening as party members, leaders, and well-wishers gathered in memory of DD Lapang. A condolence prayer meeting was held, beginning with two minutes of silence, followed by prayers for the eternal peace of the departed soul. NPP National President and Chief Minister Conrad K. Sangma described the loss as deeply personal, apart from being a great void for the state. He reflected on Lapang's long political journey, recalling the veteran leader's immeasurable service for Meghalaya and its people. TMC state president and senior

legislator Charles Pyngrope also paid tribute, recalling his long association with Lapang. He said he prayed for eternal peace for the departed soul and for strength to the bereaved family.

BSF

Buoyed with the impressive turnout from the youths of Meghalaya, The Border Security Force has extended its ongoing Constable (General Duty) Recruitment Rally in Meghalaya till September 18 following overwhelming and enthusiastic participation of youth from across the state. Since the rally commenced, the BSF has witnessed an exceptional turnout, with over 10,000 candidates already registered. Organized under the aegis of the Meghalaya Frontier Headquarters, Shillong, the recruitment rally is being conducted at two primary venues i.e BSF Campus, 200 Bn Dhanakgiri, Tura and BSF Mawpat Campus, Shillong. Participation at both locations continues to grow daily. Notably, the rally has recorded a 70:30 male-to-female participation ratio, highlighting the rising aspiration and empowerment of young women keen to serve in one of India's most respected uniformed services.

ARMY

The Indian Army's Spear Corps successfully conducted a high-intensity exercise titled 'Dibang Shakti' deep in the challenging terrain of Dibang Valley, Arunachal Pradesh. The exercise was designed to test and validate the troops' asymmetric warfare capabilities under extremely demanding conditions of dense jungles, steep mountains, and unpredictable weather. During the exercise, the troops showcased exceptional skill in a variety of tactical domains, including specialized survival techniques, jungle warfare, and combat free falls operations. The seamless coordination between various arms of the armed forces, along with advanced technology applications, demonstrated the Indian Army's focus on holistic combat readiness. This exercise further strengthened the patriotic zeal and commitment of the troops towards securing the nation's sovereignty.

FILM

Manisha Halai, a first-generation learner-turned-docu-film director from Wakro circle, Lohit District of Arunachal Pradesh, has won the prestigious Australian International Documentary Conference (AIDC) Award and the Audience Award at Bali, Indonesia, for her debut feature documentary in Kaman-Mishmi language "Orange Beetle: Mother & I", out of 292 entries from filmmakers across Asia. Awardee Manisha Halai expressed her joy stating that this was a proud and unforgettable moment for her. This marks Manisha's first time pitching her film at an international platform. Manisha, is one of the senior-most volunteer-activists of Lohit Youth Library Network and is currently the President of the Forum of Library Activists, Medo Village.

SANSKRIT

The Department of Sanskrit in Tripura University organized a two-day workshop on the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, which was inaugurated by Governor Indrasena Reddy Nallu. WEATHER

India Meteorological Department (IMD) has forecast heavy to very heavy rainfall over East and Northeastern parts of the country for the next two to three days. The IMD said that under the influence of a low-pressure area over west central and adjoining northwest Bay of Bengal, heavy rainfall is expected over Odisha, Maharashtra, Coastal Andhra Pradesh, Yanam, Chhattisgarh, Telangana and Maharashtra till 15th of this month. Heavy rainfall is also very likely over Assam, Meghalaya, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, Konkan, Goa, Maharashtra, North Interior Karnataka and North Punjab tomorrow.
