The Union Cabinet has approved Dearness Allowance (DA) to Central Government employees, and Dearness Relief (DR) to pensioners by three per cent. Briefing the media after the cabinet meeting in New Delhi today, Information and Broadcasting Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said that this will benefit about 49.2 lakh central government employees and 68.7 lakh pensioners. He said that this will be effective from 1st July this year. Some of the other key decisions by the Union Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs includes approval for the opening of 57 new Kendriya Vidyalayas across the country with an outlay of more than five thousand 862 crore rupees. Approval of the Mission for Aatmanirbharta in Pulses, aimed at boosting domestic production and achieving self-sufficiency in pulses and the increase in the Minimum Support Prices (MSP) for all mandated Rabi Crops for Marketing Season 2026-27.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi participated in the centenary celebrations of the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) in New Delhi today. The centenary celebrations highlight the legacy of RSS, its cultural contributions, and its role in the country's unity. Australia won the toss and choose to bat. Yesterday, in the opening match, India defeated Sri Lanka by 59 runs in a rain affected match at Guwahati. The 13th edition of the tournament is featuring 8 teams – India, Sri Lanka, Australia, England, New Zealand, South Africa, Bangladesh and Pakistan. The much-anticipated match between arch-rivals India and Pakistan will be played on Sunday in Colombo.
