Prime Minister Narendra Modi appealed to the citizens to unite and dedicate themselves to the nation's progress to achieve the dream of Viksit Bharat. Addressing the gathering at National Unity day celebrations in Ekta Nagar Gujarat marking the 150th birth anniversary of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, he highlighted the nationwide participation in the unity oath taken by crores of people, reaffirming the collective resolve to strengthen national unity. He emphasized that every citizen must reject any thought or action that weakens the fabric of the nation, calling it the need of the hour.

He lauded the country's linguistic diversity, calling it one of India's greatest strengths. Earlier, the Prime Minister offered floral tribute at the Statue of Unity and administered the Ekta Diwas pledge on the occasion. The Prime Minister also witnessed the grand Ekta Diwas Parade that featured various contingents and ten vibrant tableaux, reflecting the theme 'Unity in Diversity'.



Nagaland joined the rest of the nation in celebrating the 150th birth anniversary of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel today. On the occasion, Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio paid tribute to Sardar Patel, stating that Patel's vision and determination were instrumental in uniting the nation. The Chief Minister urged everyone to reaffirm their pledge to uphold the spirit of unity in diversity and work together for a stronger, more united India. Meanwhile, several events were organised across the districts to mark the occasion. Okotso village council yesterday. Mr Imchen called for avoiding favouritism in any form. Voicing deep concerns over tribalism, he described it as a serious social menace that fosters division and mistrust. Calling for collective effort to overcome tribalism, the Advisor stressed that true progress and peace can be achieved only through unity and inclusivity.

MLA and Naga People's Front (NPF) Secretary General Achumbemo Kikon reaffirmed that the early resolution of the Naga political issue remains the party's top priority. Addressing the oath-taking ceremony of the party's newly elected office bearers at the NPF Central Headquarters in Kohima today, he urged members to uphold the party's principles of peace and an honourable solution, in addition to developmental activities.

Emphasizing upon unity, discipline, and active participation, Mr Kikon called for strengthening coordination between the elected representatives and party functionaries. The Secretary General also informed that the party's central office will be shifted to Secretariat—High Court Road, Kohima.

Chief Minister Neiphiu Rio has extended greetings to the Kuki, Chin, and Mizo communities on the occasion of Chavang Kut. He described the festival, which marks the completion of the harvest season, as a time for gratitude, hard work, and strengthening unity. Mr Rio hoped that the festival would bring happiness, prosperity, and peace to all.



A book titled 'The Light After the Storm' authored by Vibeituonuo Kuotsu Solo was released today by the Joint Director of Information & Public Relations, Asangla Imsong, in Kohima. The book marks the debut of Ms. Solo, a journalist by profession, and the 112th publication under PenThrill.
