Chief Secretary Manish Kumar Gupta today delivered a lecture on "Procurement Guidelines" at the Administrative Training Institute, Naharlagun. Under the ongoing Operation Dawn 2.0, the East Siang Police apprehended two individuals and seized approximately gross 9.28 grams of suspected heroin from 4mile, Pasighat yesterday. The operation was planned by the anti-drugs squad (ADS) of East Siang in coordination with Anti-Drugs Warriors, Pasighat. An undercover buyer was deployed to approach the peddler, following which the accused, a lady peddler and one habitual drug user were caught red-handed. Accordingly, a case has been registered under the NDPS Act at Pasighat Police Station. Investigation is currently underway. SP, East Siang commended the efforts of the ADS team and reiterated the district police's firm commitment to a zero-tolerance policy against drug-related offenses. He urged the public to report such illicit activities.

The Indian Army today commenced the "Shaurya Motorcycle Rally" from Likabali Military Station. The joint rally; a tribute to the brave hearts of the 1962 India–China War, will traverse through the rugged terrain and remote valleys of Arunachal Pradesh, retracing the historic routes taken during the 1962 war. Covering a distance of approximately 900 kilometers, a total of 20 riders comprising of serving soldiers from Indian Army and ITBP and also 12 civilians from Assam & Arunachal, will pass through key battle locations interacting with local communities and promoting - NO DRUGS & NO SCHOOL DROPOUTS, an initiative by the Government of Arunachal Pradesh.

The Department of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship in collaboration with the Department of Printing & Stationery, has officially launched a two-month vocational and skill training program focused on Offset Machine Operation and Binding Works. The inauguration ceremony was held at the Directorate of Printing & Stationery, Naharlagun. A total of 35 trainees has been enrolled in this specialised program, which will cover Operation of offset printing machines, Pre-printing preparations and technical functions, Binding and finishing techniques.

The District Health Society, Lower Siang district, under the National Health Mission, launched two significant health initiatives, World Mental Health Day 2025 and the 60 Days Tobacco Free Youth Campaign 3.0 at the District Hospital, Likabali. The campaign aims to create awareness among the youth about the harmful effects of tobacco and promote a healthy, addiction-free lifestyle under the slogan "Together We Can, Say No to Tobacco, No to Addiction."
