Nagaland is hosting the 'Health Financing Forum for Cross-State Learning in the Northeast Region' in collaboration with the World Bank. Addressing the inaugural event in Chumoukedima today, Deputy Chief Minister T.R. Zeliang underscored the importance of financial reforms to ensure accessible and equitable healthcare access. Noting that effective health financing goes beyond mobilizing resources, he stressed upon efficiently using them to reach the last mile. Mr Zeliang highlighted the Northeast region's structural challenges such as rural livelihoods, difficult terrain, and limited connectivity, compounded by climate change and

rising non-communicable diseases. Acknowledging the World Bank's support, he said each Northeastern state has pursued unique approaches to improving health financing, service delivery, accountability, and governance. He urged states to adopt innovation and collaborate on strategies tailored to the Northeast's needs.

Mr Zeliang also outlined Nagaland's commitment to a resilient healthcare system, that can address challenges like demographic shifts, disease transitions, and climate change. During the event, the Deputy Chief Minister released the FinHealth Assessment Report, which outlines recommendations for reform in the region's health financing landscape. The two-day forum brings together policymakers and experts to share experiences and strategies in strengthening health systems.

The Nagaland Government has put on hold the recruitment of police constables reserved for the four Non-Naga tribes of Garos, Kacharis, Mikirs (Karbis), and Kukis, pending the outcome of an Enumeration Exercise to determine their eligibility as Indigenous Inhabitants of the state. The Home Department said, pending the legal case, the recruitment process will proceed with 1,176 posts alloted to Indigenous Naga tribes, while the 24 posts reserved for the four Non-Naga tribes will be taken up after the matter is resolved.

Nagaland is joining the nationwide observance of Wildlife Week 2025. As part of the celebrations, the Kohima Forest Division today organized a Nature Walk and awareness programme for Class 10 students of St. Peter's School, Kohima. Speaking to students, Conservator of Forests, Zuthunglo Patton, highlighted the importance of Human-Animal Coexistence as a practical necessity for survival. She urged students to learn from ancestral practices that respected nature, and stressed that protecting wildlife habitats means safeguarding the entire ecosystems. She cited Nagaland's Amur Falcon conservation as one of the greatest wildlife conservation success stories, where hunters turned protectors highlighting the power of community-led efforts. During the Nature Walk, students visited the Blyth's Tragopan Conservation and Breeding Centre. A total of 38 students and two teachers took part in the programme. Meanwhile, a special Wildlife Week programme was also held in Mon Town today which was graced by Minister for Forest, Environment & Climate Change, CL John, and Principal Chief Conservator of Forests, Vedpal Singh.

External Affairs Minister Dr. S Jaishankar has said that trust and safety are essential for the implementation of responsible Artificial Intelligence. Addressing the Trust and Safety Festival India in New Delhi today, he said, AI will transform the economies, change work habits, create new health solutions and enhance educational access, in the coming years. The Minister added that the inclusion of AI in lifestyle will impact every citizen in every corner of the world. Dr Jaishankar also stressed on the need to adopt a balanced approach to the governance of AI and to ensure effective safeguards to protect digital citizens.

Deputy Commissioner (DC) Niuland has declared the 2x5 megawatts Hovukhu Solar Power Plant as a restricted area following repeated incidents of unauthorized public entry. The DC cautioned that the plant is equipped with high-voltage electrical systems, which can be fatal especially during foggy or rainy weather. Despite fencing and warning signs installed at the plant, public continues to visit the area without authorization, posing serious risks to life and equipment. The DC warned that trespassers will be arrested and charged under Section 223 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita and other relevant laws.
