Nagaland Advisor for NSDMA and NRE, Z. Nyusietho Nyuthe, officially launched the Safer Nagaland weather mobile application yesterday. Developed by the Nagaland State Disaster Management Authority (NSDMA), the app provides real-time weather updates, location-based forecasts, and early warning alerts to help citizens prepare for and respond effectively to natural disasters and changing weather conditions. Advisor Nyuthe said the launch marks a major step in Nagaland's commitment to using digital innovation for public safety, stressing that timely information and awareness are key to reducing disaster risks.

He added that the app, an extension of the NSDMA Weather Portal, will ensure vital data reaches even the most remote areas of the State. Johnny Ruangmei, Joint CEO, NSDMA, said the app aims to become a comprehensive disaster preparedness and early warning platform, with plans to integrate alerts for lightning, earthquakes, and other emergencies.

The Joint Coordination Committee (JCC) on IAS Induction has decided to keep its proposed Tools Down Strike, scheduled to commence on October 27, on hold following a meeting with the Chief Secretary, Nagaland. In a statement issued by its media cell, the JCC informed that the decision was taken in good faith after the Chief Secretary invited the committee for a discussion and considering that the State Cabinet is expected to take a decision on the matter of selection of Non-SCS officers into IAS. However, the JCC clarified that the ongoing Pen Down Strike would continue until their demands are met. Further, the committee has requested the all government drivers' associations, and the Grade-IV staff employees to keep on hold all preparations related to the Tools Down Strike until further instructions.

Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman has said that the next generation GST reforms will make the taxation system more efficient, equitable and growth-oriented. She said, the government is committed to make life easier for the honest taxpayer. Inaugurating the new CGST Bhawan in Ghaziabad yesterday, the Minister said, efficient taxation system will boost the economic growth.

She said, GST Council has approved measures to simplify the GST registration process, making it easier, seamless, and more transparent. The Minister said that a simplified GST registration scheme will come into effect from 1st of next month. She said, automatic registration will be granted within three working days to those applicants whose monthly output tax liability does

not exceed two lakh 50 thousand rupees. She said, this reform is expected to benefit nearly 96 per cent of new applicants.
